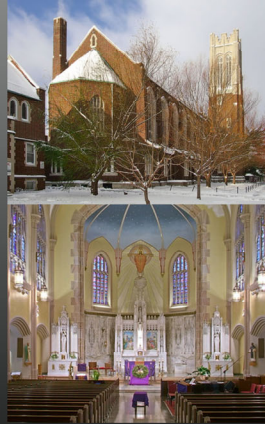

The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Grace to you and peace! **A blessed Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (*Corpus Christi*) to you and your loved ones!** Traditionally, the feast of *Corpus Christi* has been observed on the Thursday after Trinity Sunday (Thursday is dedicated to the Holy Eucharist since it was on Holy Thursday that Christ instituted the Eucharist at the Last Supper), but in recent decades, the celebration has moved to the following Sunday.

With this great feast, we exalt the glorious Sacrament of the Eucharist, “the source and summit of the Christian life” (*Lumen Gentium*, Dogmatic Constitution on the Church, 11). At the close of the *Gospel of Matthew*, Jesus promises His followers, “... I am with you always, until the end of the age” (28:20), and this promise is fulfilled in a unique manner through Christ’s abiding presence in the Eucharist. For it is through the Eucharist that Christ remains present to us—Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity. What an extraordinary gift we have in the Blessed Sacrament! Hence the reason the Church honors this “Sacrament of Sacraments” with grand Eucharistic processions throughout the whole world. I sure hope you can participate in our parish’s procession after the 10:00 a.m. Mass on Sunday.

Of special note this Sunday too is the reception of Mr. John “Jay” Ritzen into the Catholic Church! Throughout the Easter season, Jay has been preparing for his full initiation into the Catholic Church. Along with being received into the Church, Jay will be confirmed and receive his first Holy Communion. Not a bad way to celebrate *Corpus Christi*, eh?! Congratulations, Mr. John “Jay” Ritzen!

Congratulations also to Deacon Ed Grot peter celebrating his 24th ordination anniversary on June 3rd! Happy Anniversary, Deacon! Thank you for your faithful service to our parish family... Your presence is a blessing to us all. *Ad multos annos* (“To many years”)!

Well, **last weekend it was announced that Fr. Arthur J. Cavitt will be taking his retirement effective July 1, 2024.** Though this is certainly disappointing news for our parish family, we are exceedingly grateful to Fr. Art for his time with us and for his many years of faithful service to our Archdiocese and to the St. Charles Lwanga Center mission. We wish him blessings on his retirement and look forward to seeing him periodically at Sunday Masses in the future. Our prayers are with you, Fr. Art!

NEW PARISH “NAME PROPOSAL” AND PARISH NEWS AND UPDATES

ALL HOLY SOULS Submitted By Linda Ross



“All souls in heaven, not saints, but all HOLY [souls] ...” as opposed to those eternally lost.

All holy souls:

“The souls of those who departed in the grace of God but who are temporarily detained in purgatory for venial faults and for the unremitted punishment due to their forgiven sins. They are the object of the prayers of the faithful, especially the Sacrifice of the Mass offered for them.

The duration of a soul's existence in purgatory is not defined. The concept of time does not hold true in this state. However, it is ascertained that all souls in purgatory eventually find their way to heaven. Their period of suffering (purification) may depend on the seriousness of their sins.

According to the church, only God knows the exact amount of time a person must spend in purgatory before attaining a state of purity. It's assumed, however, that the severity of one's punishment will be directly proportional to the severity of the crime.”

*Last week (5/26), Fr. Art Cavitt announced his retirement at the 10:00 a.m. Mass. The *Decree of Appointment* states, “I, the Most Reverend Mitchell T. Rozanski, Metropolitan Archbishop of Saint Louis, hereby grant the Reverend Arthur J. Cavitt, formerly Senior Associate Pastor... and part-time Director of the Saint Charles Lwanga Center, retirement status with residence in the former Blessed Teresa of Calcutta Parish Rectory, effective the first day of July, in the Year of Our Lord, 2024.”

*The interior repairs to the St. Elizabeth, Mother of John the Baptist (SEMJB) church building and bell tower are now complete (Work finished on 5/20)! Starting the 2nd Week of June (6/8-6/9), the weekend liturgies will be held at SEMJB. Since we have not celebrated weekend Masses at our SEMJB location in our time together as a parish family, we will begin a three-month period of SEMJB hosting the weekend liturgies (June-August).

*The weekend of July 6th-7th will be the one exception to SEMJB hosting the weekend Masses. In the Fall of 2023, it was agreed that St. Matthew, the Apostle (SMA), would host the special Eucharistic Pilgrim's Mass on Saturday, 7/6, at 5:00 p.m. (Note the time change for the Vigil Mass). Thus, the weekend liturgies for July 6th-7th will be held at our SMA location.

*The weekday Mass rotation (Tuesday-Friday at 12:00 p.m.) will continue as scheduled. St. Matthew, the Apostle will host the month of June, Our Lady of the Holy Cross will host the month of July, and St. Augustine will host the month of August.

*The appeal process for SMA is still underway. Unfortunately, there is not a definite timeline for this process. When the decision regarding the appeal is finalized, our parish will continue with the process of naming the new parish (whether it is a three or four parish merger). A primary place of worship for the new merger will then be decided in the subsequent months.

*A common website servicing our four parishes is up and running. This website can be accessed at www.3saintsandourlady.com. This website continues to receive updates and modifications, so please continue to peruse on a regular basis.

*On Sunday, May 5th, the parish offered its first Children's Liturgy of the Word at the 10:00 a.m. Mass. We will continue to offer this ministry every week at the 10:00 a.m. Mass except on 4th Sundays when we have our “Youth Sunday.” All children (pre-school age and up) are invited to attend.

*Repairs to the basement of the St. Charles Lwanga Center building on the campus of SEMJB are expected to be finished by the end of May (5/31). As a separate issue, this building is also in need of plumbing repair (base of plumbing stack in basement needs to be replaced). Currently, this work is in the process of receiving bids. Updates will be provided when available.

*St. Louis Catholic Academy is moving its location to the former La Salle Charter School building (1106 N Jefferson Ave, St. Louis, MO 63106). As for the soon-to-be vacant school building on the campus of SEMJB, the parish is considering leasing this property to schools seeking new locations. Updates will be provided when available.
