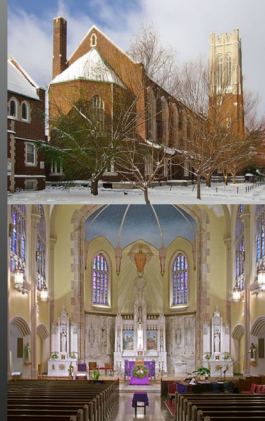

Grace to you and peace! **A blessed Solemnity of St. Louis, King of France to you all!** August 25th marks the annual feast of St. Louis, King of France, and since our parish boundaries lie in the City of St. Louis proper, we have the privilege to honor our patron at the Sunday Mass. Also, this week **we have the opportunity to celebrate St. Augustine! Wednesday, August 28th, the parish family will gather at the weekday 12:00 p.m. Mass to exalt this glorious patron with the Mass of the Solemnity of St. Augustine!** A time of fellowship with refreshments will follow so consider stopping by our St. Augustine site for a mid-week break. St. Louis, King of France, and St. Augustine, pray for us!

Well, the final rankings are in and the proposed parish names have been submitted to Archbishop Rozanski for his final decision! In **1st place is St. Peter Claver with 209 points received**, in **2nd place is Mary, Queen of the Apostles with 172 points received**, and in **3rd place is Most Holy Rosary with 128 points received**. Thank you, again, to all who participated in the parish naming process and to the parish staff who helped tally the votes each week!

It was quite the blessing last Sunday to honor Mr. Kentrell Wallace as he prepares to go overseas and serve our country in the Army. Thank you for your service, Mr. Kentrell! We will continue to pray for you and all our parishioners serving in the armed forces!

This week, at our 10:00 a.m. Mass, we will conclude our celebration with a special commissioning of our Stephen Ministry team. The Stephen Ministers are a group of parishioners “trained to provide one-to-one care to those experiencing a difficult time in life, such as grief, divorce, job loss, chronic or terminal illness, or relocation” (from stephenministries.org). Thank you to our Stephen Ministry team and to Mrs. Teresa Scurlock-Rice and Mrs. Margaret Ann McCabe, for your service to our parish family!

Well, **we have come to the final week of our journey through the Gospel of John, “Chapter 6,” and it is decision time!** We hear that as a result of Jesus’ radical teaching “many of his disciples returned to their former way of life and no longer accompanied him” (John 6:66). Jesus, then, turns to the Twelve and asks, “Do you also want to leave?” (John 6:67). Without hesitating, Peter answers, “Master, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life. 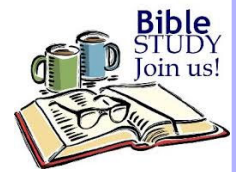

- ◇ First, we send our congratulations to **FR. SCOTT SCHEIDERER**. After a year as our Parochial Administrator, we are proud to announce FR. SCOTT is now PASTOR of our four parish sites. This was effective on August 15, 2024. Father's installation will take place at a later date once our new parish name is confirmed.
- ◇ Second, next Wednesday, **August 28**, we celebrate the **solemnity of St. Augustine**. Following the 12:00 noon Mass, we will have a time of fellowship with refreshments to celebrate one of our patron saints. Perhaps you can stop by our St. Augustine site and join us in fellowship.
- ◇ **Weekend Masses (Saturday Vigil at 4:00 p.m. and Sunday at 8:00 a.m. and 10:00 a.m.) for the month of September will be held at the St. Augustine (SA) site.** St. Matthew, the Apostle (SMA) will host the weekend Masses in the month of October.
- ◇ **Weekday Mass (Tuesday-Friday at 12:00 p.m.) for the month of September will be at the SMA site.** Our Lady of the Holy Cross (OLHC) will host the month of October.
- ◇ **Monday morning Mass at 10:00 a.m. will continue at Hillside Rehab and Healthcare Center (1265 McLaran Ave, 63147).** St. Louis Catholic Academy will be changing the day and frequency of All-School Masses being offered, so we are able to continue this weekly Mass.
- ◇ **The discernment for our primary place of worship will begin after the Labor Day weekend (8/31-9/1).** We will be conducting site visits for each parish where parishioners will have the opportunity to evaluate each location's strengths/weaknesses. Dates and times for these site visits will be announced in the coming weeks.
- ◇ **A "Welcoming Committee" will be forming at our parish.** If you are interested in helping out with this ministry, please contact the parish office or Fr. Scott Scheiderer (scott.scheiderer@archstl.org).
- ◇ **A common website servicing our four parishes can be accessed at www.3saintsandourlady.com.** Once the new parish name becomes finalized, the website address and parish information will be updated and changed.
- ◇ **Children's Liturgy of the Word will continue to be offered every week at the 10:00 a.m. Mass except on 4th Sundays when we have our "Youth Sunday."** All children (pre-school age and up) are invited to attend.
