

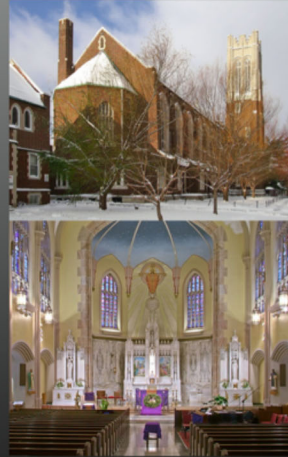

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,
 Grace to you and peace! **Last Tuesday, December 17th, marked the beginning of a time of intense preparation for the coming of our Lord at Christmas.** These solemn days of the Advent season, which extend to this Tuesday, December 24th, are days set apart where we are called to reflect more deeply in anticipation of the mystery of our Lord’s Nativity. In our daily Gospel throughout this “pre-Christmas” octave (eight days of preparation before the great feast), we hear from the Infancy Narratives of both the Gospel of Matthew (Matthew 1:1-25) and the Gospel of Luke (Luke 1:1-79), and we follow closely the examples Mary and Joseph in their preparation for the coming of their Son. What exemplary models we have in our spiritual parents, Mary and Joseph—Joseph with his humble, diligent obedience to the Lord’s prompts and Mary with her pondering heart and trustful surrender!

And now, on this 4th Sunday of Advent, we are privileged to hear the “Visitation” account (Luke 1:39-45) and witness the effects of Mary’s total “yes” to God. The angel Gabriel describes to Mary how she will become the Mother of God: “The holy Spirit will come upon you, the power of the Most High will overshadow you. Therefore, the child to be born will be called holy, the Son of God” (Luke 1:35). Following her “*Fiat*” or “yes” to God’s plans for her life (“Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord. May it be done to me according to your word” [Luke 1:38]), Mary is compelled to love, to make a gift of herself in service to her cousin Elizabeth, and we see that, thereafter, wherever she goes, she brings the life of the Holy Spirit. Mary is so full of the Holy Spirit that she becomes a living instrument of God’s Love. I pray that we as a parish family can all imitate our Blessed Mother in our response to the Lord’s Will for our lives. I am very confident, the more profound our “Yes” to God is, the more His peace and joy will radiate in our homes and in our community!

As we close out the Advent season and enter into the exalted Christmas season, may the tender love of the Infant Child infill your hearts and minds and abide with you always! Know that you, your loved ones, and your intentions will be prayed for in a special way as I go to the altar in celebration of our Lord’s Nativity. Merry Christmas! Glory to God in the highest!

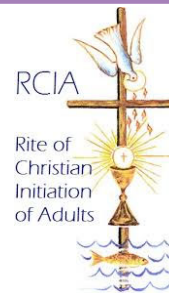
Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA)

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

On May 9, 2024, Pope Francis issued “SPES NON CONFUNDIT” (Hope does not disappoint), Bull of Induction of the Ordinary Jubilee of the Year 2025. The Holy Father invited “everyone to an intense experience of the love of God” and “calls on all Christians to become Pilgrims of Hope.”

The Jubilee 2025 - Pilgrims of Hope will begin on December 24, 2024, with the opening of the Holy Door at the Basilica of St. Peter in Rome and continue until the closing of the Jubilee Year on January 6, 2026.

I invite all the faithful to join Bishop Mark Rivotuso to celebrate the solemn opening of the Jubilee on Sunday, December 29, 2024, at the 10:00 a.m. Mass at the Cathedral Basilica of St. Louis, 4431 Lindell Boulevard. The Jubilee will conclude locally on December 28, 2025.

As part of the Jubilee, the faithful of the Archdiocese of St. Louis will be able to obtain the grace of the Jubilee Indulgence by making a pious pilgrimage to any sacred Jubilee site under the usual conditions. I have designated nine Jubilee pilgrimage sites across the archdiocese:

Cathedral Basilica of St. Louis
Basilica of Saint Louis, King of France
Holy Spirit Adoration Sisters at the Mount Grace Covent and Chapel
Carmel of Saint Joseph at the Chapel of the Most Precious Blood
Saint Mary’s of the Barrens National Shrine of Our Lady of the Miraculous Medal
Monastery of Saint Clare of the Immaculate Conception
Passionist Nuns of St. Louis
Immaculate Heart of Mary Catholic Church in New Melle
Immaculate Conception Catholic Church in Union

WE CALL YOUR ATTENTION TO

- ◆ If you are planning to attend our midnight Mass for The Nativity of the Lord on December 25 we will have security on site from 10:00 p.m. until 2:00 a.m.
- ◆ Coming up is the celebration of Kwanzaa, which begins on December 26 and runs seven days until January 1. Here at St. Peter Claver Parish we will celebrate Kwanzaa on Sunday, December 29, at the 10:00 a.m. Mass. **We invite you to don African-inspired apparel for our celebration this day.**

“Kwanzaa is a celebration that has its roots in the black nationalist movement of the 1960s and was established as a means to help African Americans reconnect with their African cultural and historical heritage by uniting in meditation and study of African traditions and Nguzo Saba, the ‘seven principles of African Heritage’ which Karenga said ‘is a communitarian African philosophy’. Karenga believed and stated that **‘you must have a cultural revolution before the violent revolution. The cultural revolution gives identity, purpose and direction.’**”

Kwanzaa was not created to give people an alternative to their own religion or religious holiday. Many African Americans who celebrate Kwanzaa do so in addition to observing Christmas.

Kwanzaa spans over seven days with each day focusing on a specific principle in the Black community. A Kwanzaa ceremony may include drumming and musical selections, libations, a reading of the African Pledge and a discussion of the African principle of the day or a chapter in African history and a feast known as the ‘karamu’.

Each day also consists of a candle-lighting ritual. You have what is called a kinara (candle holder) and seven candles (one black candle, three green candles and three red candles). The black candle is lit first then used to light each of the other candles on the day that is celebrated, going back and forth with lighting the red and green.

The seven principles of Kwanzaa are as follows:

1. Umoja (Unity)
2. Kujichagulia (Self-Determination)
3. Ujima (Collective Work and Responsibility)
4. Ujamaa (Cooperative Economics)
5. Nia (Purpose)
6. Kuumba (Creativity)
7. Imani (Faith)

Other Kwanzaa celebratory symbols are representative of values and concepts reflective of African culture and contribution to community building and reinforcement. With corn being the primary symbol for both decoration and celebratory dining.”


- ◆ Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph will also be honored on the weekend of December 28 and 29 at all Masses.
- ◆ The Mass for the Preservation of Peace and Justice is the second Sunday in Ordinary Time and Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.’s birthday celebration follows on Monday, January 20, this year. These observances generate volunteers to do service hours. So, Monday, January 20, here at St. Peter Claver Parish we will be hosting a service day to tackle the many service projects just waiting for attention. If you have time and talent to join us on the 20th, please fill out one of the forms you will find in the back of church and return it in the offertory basket, give it to one of the ushers or Father Scheiderer so we include you in the plan for volunteering and know where you prefer to help. Questions regarding this service day may be directed to the Parish Office.
- ◆ Finally, the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time has been designated by the Pope as the “Sunday of the Word of God”. On this Sunday we will be gifting Bibles to our **youth and young adults**. Please plan to join us at Mass on the weekend of January 25 and 26.
