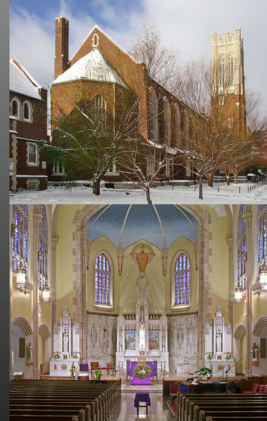

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Grace to you and peace! **This weekend our Masses will coincide with the long-anticipated National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis** which began earlier in the week on Wednesday, July 17th, and continues through Sunday, July 21st. This is the 10th National Eucharistic Congress in the United States and the first in 83 years, so it promises to be quite the event. Let us pray for the fruitfulness of this historic occasion that it truly works to build up the Church in faith, especially, faith in the Most Holy Eucharist. Also, let us extend our prayers to the members of the parish family who are attending this monumental celebration!

In our Gospel this week, Jesus invites his disciples to "come away by yourselves to a deserted place and rest awhile" (Mark 6:31). The disciples have just labored in the Lord's vineyard, and now, Jesus is calling them to be with him and rest. **There can be a real temptation in our everyday work to get so caught up in the busyness of our labors that we forget to take the necessary time for prayer and rest.** I love earlier in Mark's Gospel, when Jesus appoints the twelve apostles, the text indicates how their first responsibility is to be with Jesus: "He appointed twelve (whom he also named apostles) that they might be with him..." (3:14). This reminds us that before we undertake any mission, we need to spend time in relationship with the Lord. This will ultimately serve to root us in our identity "in Him" and to give us the "know-how" and the strength to take on whatever He asks. So too, as we continue in mission, we need the proper restoration "in Christ" which can only come from time alone in His Presence.

Hopefully, in these summer months, you are finding time to escape from the busyness of everyday life to be "with him" even if it is just for a moment. A short, intentional pause to recollect oneself and call to mind God's holy presence will bear fruit thirty, sixty, and a hundredfold. Truly, nothing compares to the rest our Lord offers!

"Come to me, all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest" (Matthew 11:28). God love you! My prayers remain for you all!

Mass offerings may be requested for a special date; i.e., anniversary of death, wedding anniversary, etc., but must be verified the date is available and has not already been requested by another individual. Only one offering a day is permitted. This verification is done by Fr. Scheiderer. The offering to be given for the celebration of the Mass for a particular intention is ten dollars for the Province of St. Louis. “If a member of the faithful spontaneously gives a larger or smaller offering, however, it may be accepted.” The Mass Offering will be recorded in the Parish bulletin.

***We continue our weekend Masses at St. Elizabeth, Mother of John the Baptist (SEMJB) through the month of August.** The times for our weekend liturgies remain the same: 4:00 p.m. (Saturday Vigil Mass); 8:00 a.m. and 10:00 a.m. (Sunday Mass).

***Weekday Mass (Tuesday-Friday at 12:00 p.m.) is at the Our Lady of the Holy Cross site for the month of July.** St. Augustine will host the month of August.

***For the summer months, Monday morning Mass will be at 10:00 a.m. at Hillside Rehab and Healthcare Center (1265 McLaran Ave, 63147).** When the St. Louis Catholic Academy All-School Mass resumes, the “Hillside Mass” will discontinue and a prayer service will be held instead. **We welcome anyone who wishes to join us on Mondays.**
