Thank you also to those who participated in and volunteered for the St. Vincent de Paul Society's "Walk for the Poor" at St. Clement of Rome and the "Voter Information Session" at SMA! Whew!

What an event-packed weekend... So many ways to get involved in our parish. I hope you're taking advantage of these opportunities!

In the coming weeks, you'll notice an emphasis on stewardship at our weekend Masses. **We want and need you to be active in the life of the parish family!** Whether it is through your time in prayer and worship, your participation in events and activities or through your generous financial giving, your presence and contribution is greatly desired and appreciated.

Officially, this weekend, September 21st/22nd, marks the archdiocesan wide Stewardship Awareness Sunday, but as it is often said, stewardship is not something we limit to one weekend a year, rather, "it is a lifestyle we live everyday" (Archdiocese of St. Louis, "Office of Stewardship"). When we acknowledge that everything we are and everything we have is a gift from God, we are prompted to give back and use our gifts in a manner that gives glory to God.

This year's stewardship theme is "A Steward Is a Servant of All." It is pulled from today's Gospel where Jesus calls the Twelve and says to them, "If anyone wishes to be first, he shall be the last of all and the servant of all" (Mark 9:35). These words come as an admonishment from our Lord, for just prior to saying these words, the disciples "had been discussing among themselves on the way who was the greatest" (Mark 9:34). Because they failed to think about the gifts entrusted to them and how they were being called to serve, Jesus has to remind them that their exalted status as disciples calls forth tremendous responsibility. "Much will be required of the person entrusted with much, and still more will be demanded of the person entrusted with more" (Luke 12:48).

As children of God, we are blessed beyond comprehension. Let us be ever mindful of this and continue to ponder how God is calling us to make a return on His investment. God bless and keep you all! My prayers remain!

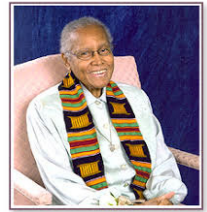

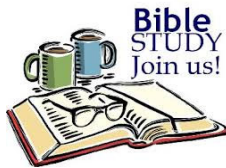

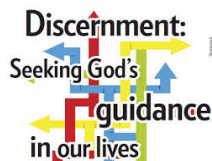

**BRIEF UPDATE OF THE RICE CENTER
AND A BRIEF SUMMARY OF OUR LADY OF THE HOLY CROSS OUTREACH**

ST. MATTHEW, THE APOSTLE'S RICE CENTER

A little more about The Child and Family Empowerment Center (CAFÉ) located at 4145 Kennerly Avenue. The property is owned by St. Matthew, the Apostle parish but is leased to The Child and Family Empowerment Center. CAFÉ is a safe haven for the homeless and those who are substance abusers. They assist recovering addicts gain control of their lives by finding housing and jobs. The residents have access to the Center Monday-Friday. The Center has great resources and community connections. Every Friday they have a church service.

OUR LADY OF THE HOLY CROSS

The Our Lady of the Holy Cross (OLHC) campus property encompasses eight acres. The campus has four major buildings:

- the church and rectory
- the school building
- the convent (Assisi House Inc. IV)
- the hall (Parish Center and gym)

Our rectory is a three story structure with kitchen, dining room, bathroom and office space on the first floor. On the first floor there is a working elevator to the second floor, which requires a safety inspection and would need to be brought up to code. The second and third floors were the priests' quarters. There are many steps from the first to second to third floors. It currently sits vacant.

The school building is two stories with classrooms on the first and second floors and in the basement as well. Currently the first floor leases one room to the Baden Montessori School at \$762.50 a month. The room had to be renovated according to Montessori guidelines at the expense of the lessee. She has two students this school year and her lease expires November 30, 2024. Also on the first floor is the Parish Office. The basement houses the office of Sr. Carlene Welker, D.C., Pastoral Administrator and both boys and girls restrooms.

The Assisi House occupies the convent space. This building was renovated in 2017 to accommodate ten women transitioning from homelessness back to society at the lessee's expense. It is managed by their staff. It has two stories and an attic and, similar to the rectory, has many steps. The first floor is a common area with a family room, dining room, kitchen and bathroom. The resident housing is on the second floor and each resident has their own room. There is a laundry room on the second floor and in the basement. Our parish receives rent of \$1,375 a month plus utilities. Lease expiration is November 30, 2024.

Our final building is the school cafeteria (hall/Parish Center) and is leased to the Community Center who prepares lunch for those in the community twice a week. The Center is funded by grants and donations. It has a full kitchen and is available for luncheons, special events, i.e., birthday parties, anniversaries, baby showers, etc. The Community Center's rent is \$100 per month. Narcotics Anonymous holds weekly meetings every Friday and provides a small donation to the parish. We have one handicap bathroom in the Center as well as both women and men restrooms. There is also an entrance from the lower parking lot which is handicap accessible.

Upstairs from the Parish Center is the gym. It has a full stage and a basketball court. The St. Louis Majestics Basketball Team leases the gym on an hourly basis, \$12.50 an hour. They have access to the gym three days a week from 6:00-8:00 p.m. They are billed only when it is used. There is a boys and girls bathroom in the gym. There is access via steps from the gym to the Parish Center.

Also, the campus has three gardens: Sophia Butterfly Garden, Prairie Grass and the Baden Community Vegetable Garden.

The Baden Community Vegetable Garden is leased to the Assisi House at \$2,000 a year. It is structured so we have community and individual beds. It is managed and maintained by an urban gardener and the volunteers that have their own beds. Grants from Barnes-Jewish Hospital, Bayer and Brightside, to mention a few, continue to support this effort. When harvested, the excess produce and the vegetables from the community beds are available to the community at large. A Fall Fest is held annually usually in October for all those in the community and surrounding areas. Plans are being presented to add a pavilion to the garden area to shade those working the garden.

MASS OFFERING/MASS INTENTION

A Mass Offering is an offering attached to celebrating a Mass for a particular intention; i.e., healing, death, special anniversary, special birthday or special intention. Mass offerings may be requested for a special date; i.e., anniversary of death, wedding anniversary, etc., but must be verified the date is available and has not already been requested by another individual. Only one offering a day is permitted. This verification is done by Fr. Scheiderer. The offering to be given for the celebration of the Mass for a particular intention is ten dollars for the Province of St. Louis. "If a member of the faithful spontaneously gives a larger or smaller offering, however, it may be accepted." The Mass Offering will be recorded in the Parish bulletin. Envelopes are available at the entrances to church for your convenience.
