Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Grace to you and peace! Well, the month of November is now upon us. I always love the beginning of the month of November in the Catholic Church because we're reminded as a Church, as the Body of Christ, of the immensity of our family in faith. The Church teaches that our family abides in three states not limited by space nor time: the pilgrim Church here on earth making their way toward their heavenly homeland, also known as the Church Militant; the Church who have passed and are being purified, that is, the Church Suffering; and, finally, the Church Triumphant, our brothers and sisters in heaven. So, at the beginning of the month, we celebrate the holy sanctified in heaven with the Solemnity of All Saints, and we, the pilgrim Church on earth invoke their intercessory aid as they stand before the throne of God beholding Him in glory. The next day, November 2nd, the Church Militant is called to take up their "spiritual arms" and pray for those who have passed and are being purified on the feast of All Souls or, more formally, the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed.

As a special way of honoring our "church family" in this month of November, we will be doing several things. First, we will be putting on display in the sanctuary our many saint relics. We as a combined church family, have an extensive collection of relics, and we want the faithful to have an opportunity to share in this great treasure. Thank you to Ms. Pam Mason, Ms. Lynda Brand and Mr. Bill Collier for organizing this effort! Next, to honor the faithful departed, we will have a "Book of the Deceased" placed near the sanctuary where parishioners can inscribe the names of their loved ones who have passed on to the next life. All throughout the month of November, we will call them to mind and pray for them at our Masses. Additionally, there will be "Book of the Deceased" that will specifically honor the deceased parishioners of the past year. This book will be artistically inscribed by the Holy Spirit Adoration Sisters (The "Pink Sisters"), and when available, it will be displayed in the sanctuary. Finally, mark your calendars for next weekend (November 9th/10th) when we will, again, honor the deceased of the past year at the weekend Masses. Eternal rest grant unto them, O' Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them!

Well, as we begin our time at the new primary place of worship, we are blessed with a special feast day on Thursday, November 7th, the "Solemnity of St. Engelbert," the patron saint of the original church building. As we celebrated many of the patronal saints of the former churches in the past few months, we will now honor this martyr bishop of the 13th century with a special 12:00 p.m. Mass and adoration. Following this time of worship, a time of fellowship and refreshments will follow. Please consider participating in this event. St. Engelbert, pray for us!

My prayers remain for you all! God bless and keep you always!

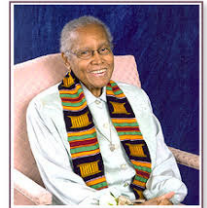

MASS OFFERING/MASS INTENTION

A Mass Offering is an offering attached to celebrating a Mass for a particular intention; i.e., healing, death, special anniversary, special birthday or special intention. Mass offerings may be requested for a special date; i.e., anniversary of death, wedding anniversary, etc., but must be verified the date is available and has not already been requested

by another individual. Only one offering a day is permitted. This verification is done by Fr. Scheiderer. The offering to be given for the celebration of the Mass for a particular intention is ten dollars for the Province of St. Louis. “If a member of the faithful spontaneously gives a larger or smaller offering, however, it may be accepted.” The Mass Offering will be recorded in the Parish bulletin. Envelopes are available at the entrances to church for your convenience.



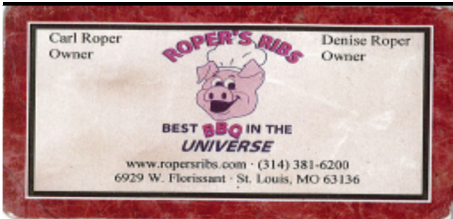
RETIREMENT FUND FOR RELIGIOUS
