Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Grace to you and peace! Well, it is wonderful to have Fr. Art Cavitt back with us to celebrate the 10:00 a.m. Mass! May God bless him with His abundant grace as he begins this next phase of his life. Being the servant leader he is, we know that his service to the Lord and His people will remain steadfast so continue to support him and his ministry with your prayers (I know you will!). We pray too for all our youth and young adults beginning a new academic year! It was great to have

beginning a new academic year! It was great to have some of our students come forward and receive a blessing at the 10:00 a.m. Mass last week. We know, though, that there are many more out there so I extend God's blessing upon them as well: "Lord God, your Spirit of wisdom fills the earth and teaches us your ways. Look upon these students. Let them enjoy their learning and take delight in new discoveries. Help them to persevere in their studies and give them the desire to learn all things well... Grant that [these] students... may follow Jesus Christ, the way, the truth, and the life, for ever and ever. Amen" (*Book of Blessings*, "Blessing of Students and Teachers").

This week we have the joy of celebrating the "Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary," a holy day of obligation for the faithful. To accommodate this responsibility to attend Mass, we will add an extra Mass to our daily Mass schedule. Mass times for the holy day will be 12:00 p.m. and 6:00 p.m. at our St. Augustine location. I hope to see you there as we celebrate this great mystery of our Blessed Mother being received body and soul into heavenly glory!

In our Gospel today, we are in "Week 3 of 5" of our trek through the Gospel of John, "Chapter 6." I hope you have been enjoying this deep dive into Jesus' "Bread of Life" discourse. Consider taking some time outside of Mass to really ponder these words of our Lord. The more we read and pray with these exalted verses, the more the Holy Spirit will open up our understanding and appreciation of the gift He's offering through the Holy Eucharist. In our text today, there is a subtle allusion (John 6:51) to the "Tree of Life" in Genesis. The "Tree of Life" offered first man and first woman the food of immortality, but God prevented them from eating of this tree after they fell from grace because, in His mercy, He didn't want them to have eternal life in a state of separation from Him (Genesis 3:22). Now that reconciliation has come to humanity through Jesus Christ, though, we are again able to eat of a "food" that gives immortality, the Holy Eucharist! How blessed we are! May we remember this, week-in and week-out, as we approach God's Holy Altar! God loves you... My prayers remain for you always!



PROCESS OVERVIEW FOR NAMING A NEW PARISH

- S Last week, August 3rd/4th, there was a list of proposed parish names inserted in the bulletin. Parishioners placed an asterisk (*) next to the name they preferred and returned their sheets to the collection basket. They also submitted votes in-person at the parish office, through the phone, and through email. The deadline for submittals was the end of business, Thursday, August 8th (5:00 p.m.). On Friday, August 9th, a team of parish staff members tabulated the results.
- S This week, August 10th/11th, a list of the "Top 7" vote-getters is inserted in the bulletin. You now have the opportunity to rank your three most preferred names placing a "1" next to your 1st choice, a "2" next to your 2nd choice, and a "3" next to your 3rd choice (again, print your name on your sheet). The ranking results will be calculated according to a point value system (1st place votes will receive "3 points," 2nd place votes will receive "2 points," and 3rd place votes will receive "1 point"). The deadline for ranking your preferred names will be the end of business, Thursday, August 15th (5:00 p.m.). On Friday, August 16th, parish staff members will calculate the point totals for all the rankings.
- Finally, on the weekend of August 17th/18th, the point value for each parish name will be given, and the "Top 3" names will be presented to Archbishop Rozanski. Archbishop Rozanski will then select our parish name.

MASS OFFERING/MASS INTENTION

A Mass Offering is an offering attached to celebrating a Mass for a particular intention; i.e., healing, death, special anniversary, special birthday or special intention. Mass offerings may be requested for a special date; i.e., anniversary of death, wedding anniversary, etc., but must be verified the date is available and has not already been requested by another individual. Only one offering a day is permitted. This verification is done by Fr. Scheiderer. The offering to be given for the celebration of the Mass for a particular intention is ten dollars for the Province of St. Louis. "If a member of the faithful spontaneously gives a larger or smaller offering, however, it may be accepted." The Mass Offering will be recorded in the Parish bulletin. Envelopes are available at the entrances to church for your convenience.

SAFE ENVIRONMENT PROGRAM

All volunteers and employees who work with children must be in full compliance with the Safe Environment Program. This includes attending Protecting God's Children workshop, undergoing a background check, and signing the Code of Ethical Conduct. These requirements are mandated by the United States Council of Catholic Bishops and are followed by every diocese in the country. The policies are the Church's attempt to ensure the suitability of all adults who work or volunteer around your children. If you have any questions about your compliance, please contact any of our parish child safety coordinators.
