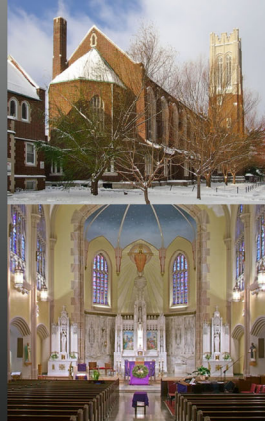

Well, it's hard to believe, but this weekend marks the 1-year anniversary of our four parishes worshipping together as one, and now that the final appeal has been decided, the Archbishop's decree merging us together as a newly-erected parish is officially in effect... Yes, my friends, we are one!

I am so grateful to God for the manner in which our parish family has persevered through the many challenges we've faced and how we continue to grow in our love, support, and prayer for one another. It is awe-inspiring and I am honored (and humbled!) to be your shepherd. Let us continue to pray for parish unity and that we remain open and faithful to God's will for our future together. Come, Holy Spirit!

As mentioned last weekend, the next step we take is to name our newly-formed parish. The process by which we name our parish is outlined on page 6 of this bulletin. This will be a week-by-week discernment where we slowly distill our "Top 3" choices for a new parish name. These names will then be submitted to the Archbishop, and he will make the final decision as to what we will be called. After our name is decided, we will begin deliberations regarding our primary place of worship. The criteria by which we will judge which location is the most conducive to our "new life" together will be outlined in the weeks ahead, so stay tuned for that information.

Well, our journey through the Gospel of John "Chapter 6" continues this week, and Jesus begins his "Bread of Life" discourse proper with the words, "I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me will never hunger, and whoever believes in me will never thirst" (6:35). Jesus reminds us that it is in Him we find our deepest fulfillment. As St. Augustine famously wrote, "You have made us for yourself, O' Lord, and our hearts are restless until they rest in you." Let us, therefore, set our hearts and minds on Him, whom we know, will never leave us wanting. God bless and keep you always. My prayers remain for you all! Happy 1-year anniversary!

PROCESS OVERVIEW FOR NAMING A NEW PARISH

- ☉ Inserted in this week's bulletin (August 3rd/4th) is a list of the proposed parish names we have accumulated throughout our time together. Place an asterisk (*) next to the parish name you prefer (limit 1 selection per person) and return the sheet in the collection basket with your name on the sheet (this is to ensure that there is 1 vote per person). If you need more time to decide which name you prefer, you can submit your preference to our parish offices later in the week. The deadline for submittals will be the end of business, Thursday, August 8th (5:00 p.m.). On Friday, August 9th, a team of parish staff members will tabulate the results.
- ☉ The following week, August 10th/11th, a list of the "Top 7" vote-getters will be inserted into the bulletin. You will then have the opportunity to rank your three most preferred names placing a "1" next to your 1st choice, a "2" next to your 2nd choice, and a "3" next to your 3rd choice (again, print your name on your sheet). The ranking results will be calculated according to a point value system (1st place votes will receive "3 points," 2nd place votes will receive "2 points," and 3rd place votes will receive "1 point"). The deadline for ranking your preferred names will be the end of business, Thursday, August 15th (5:00 p.m.). On Friday, August 16th, parish staff members will calculate the point totals for all the rankings.
- ☉ Finally, on the weekend of August 17th/18th, the point value for each parish name will be given, and the "Top 3" names will be presented to Archbishop Rozanski. Archbishop Rozanski will then select our parish name.

MASS OFFERING/MASS INTENTION

A Mass Offering is an offering attached to celebrating a Mass for a particular intention; i.e., healing, death, special anniversary, special birthday or special intention. Mass offerings may be requested for a special date; i.e., anniversary of death, wedding anniversary, etc., but must be verified the date is available and has not already been requested by another individual. Only one offering a day is permitted. This verification is done by Fr. Scheiderer. The offering to be given for the celebration of the Mass for a particular intention is ten dollars for the Province of St. Louis. "If a member of the faithful spontaneously gives a larger or smaller offering, however, it may be accepted." The Mass Offering will be recorded in the Parish bulletin. Envelopes are available at the entrances to church for your convenience.

SAFE ENVIRONMENT PROGRAM

All volunteers and employees who work with children must be in full compliance with the Safe Environment Program. This includes attending Protecting God's Children workshop, undergoing a background check, and signing the Code of Ethical Conduct. These requirements are mandated by the United States Council of Catholic Bishops and are followed by every diocese in the country. The policies are the Church's attempt to ensure the suitability of all adults who work or volunteer around your children. If you have any questions about your compliance, please contact any of our parish child safety coordinators.
