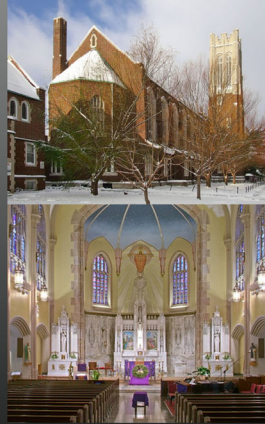

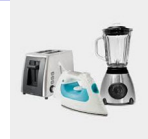

**NEW PARISH “NAME PROPOSAL”**

**MARY, QUEEN OF THE APOSTLES**

Mary, Queen of the Apostles, is the name of a newly founded Benedictine Congregation by Sister Mary Wilhelmina of the Most Holy Rosary O.S.B. Mary Wilhelmina was born Mary Elizabeth Lancaster in April, 1924 in St. Louis, MO. She was black and Catholic. At the age of seven Mary had a zeal for the rosary. She had her playmates praying with her. As a child Mary attended John Marshal and Holy Ghost Catholic Church. Mary attended St. Joseph High School for the Colored. She then joined the Oblate Sisters of Providence. She left the Oblate Sisters of Providence in 1995 and founded the Benedictines of Mary, Queen of the Apostles, in Scranton, Pennsylvania.



With the name of Mary (who said yes), Queen of the Apostles (who said yes), we say, “Yes, Lord we will continue to do your will.”

**QUEEN OF THE APOSTLES**

Apostle, simply stated is each of the twelve chief disciples of Jesus Christ but the term means “the one who is sent”. However, an apostle was more than a messenger. For the word "apostle" in a general sense means anyone who is sent forth on a mission, specially delegated, so that anyone with a mission from God to man may be called an apostle—as we call St. Patrick the Apostle to Ireland, or St. Francis Xavier the Apostle to the Indies.

Mary was not one of the official Apostles, not one of those commissioned to go forth and preach the Gospel – she was designated Queen of the Apostles and she was accepted by them as their Queen.

With faith entrusted to the Apostles, they knew the supremacy of sanctity that was Mary's by her Immaculate Conception and on account of her being chosen to be the Mother of God. They knew, too, how she had cooperated in the work of the Redemption.

They had been closely associated with her during the years of the public ministry of Jesus. They knew that on the Cross He had appointed her to be Mother of all Apostles in the person of St. John, and indeed, Mother of all men. She had persevered with them in prayer in the Cenacle while they waited for the coming of the Holy Ghost. During all their long association with her before the Crucifixion and after, but particularly the days of the initial formation of the Church, they knew her importance in the Divine Plan. They knew that since she was the Mother of the Head of the Church, she was the Mother of the Church—their Mother.

But it was His will that she remain on earth for some years after His Ascension. Why? It was because she was needed on earth. The title "Queen of Apostles" explains that. She was particularly the adviser of the Apostles. That was an extraordinary office, when you consider the importance of the apostolic position.

As we read about the success of the Apostles and marvel at it, the thought comes to us, how much of it was due to the prayers of the Mother of God who was mothering the infant Church. The Apostles knew that she was their most helpful advocate on earth. They necessarily regarded her as their Queen.

This being said the Apostles were commissioned to go forth and preach the Gospel and the Queen of the Apostles being an advisor and advocate of the Apostles, isn't this what we have been lead to do at our new parish – spreading the Gospel and continuing Jesus' ministry?

Shouldn't our name express our mission?
