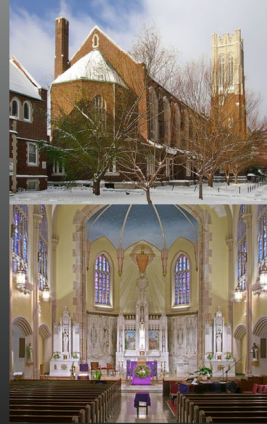

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Grace to you and peace! And **God's blessing be upon you and yours as we anticipate the celebration of our nation's Independence on the 4th of July this coming week!** I hope and pray you have a joyful and safe celebration with your loved ones. We will continue our regular schedule of daily Mass for this special event and offer the **Mass for Independence Day at 12:00 p.m. at the Our Lady of the Holy Cross (OLHC) site.** As a reminder, daily Mass (Tuesday through Friday at 12:00 p.m.) for the month of July will be held at our OLHC location. Let us pray for our country on this federal holiday that we become stronger and more united as we confess in our *Pledge of Allegiance*: "...one nation under God, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all."

Last weekend, the Archdiocese of St. Louis released a lengthy report titled *Slavery in the Historic Archdiocese of St. Louis.* This report was published in conjunction with the Archdiocese's third annual Maafa procession. In 2018, Archbishop Carlson initiated a research project wherein the Archdiocesan Office of Archives and Records examined the history of enslavement by bishops and clergy of the Archdiocese of St. Louis. Archbishop Rozanski expanded this effort to include the Office of Racial Harmony in order to understand and address the Archdiocese's historical involvement and the impact of its transgressions. Archbishop Rozanski, in a press release, expressed that he understands this is a difficult conversation to have, and his hope is that this report "will lead to greater discussion on the legacy of enslaved people in our community and that we may begin to tell the stories of the families and individuals who were harmed." Let us pray this public acknowledgment bears fruit and works toward greater healing and reconciliation in our Archdiocese and in our communities. We pray in a special way this weekend for Fr. Art Cavitt, who will be transitioning into retirement status with residence at the former Blessed Teresa of Calcutta rectory effective Monday, July 1st. Fr. Art will be making visits to us in the near future, but first, he will be taking some much-deserved time for rest and relaxation as he begins this next phase of his life. **We are deeply indebted to you, Fr. Art, for your selfless, joyful, and Spirit-filled ministry to our parish family! Thank you for your faithful service and know of our continued prayers for you!**

***With the one exception of the July 6th and 7th weekend, all weekend Masses will be held at St. Elizabeth, Mother of John the Baptist (SEMJB) through the month of August.** The times for our weekend liturgies will remain the same: 4:00 p.m. (Saturday Vigil Mass); 8:00 a.m. and 10:00 a.m. (Sunday Mass).

***Weekday Mass (Tuesday-Friday at 12:00 p.m.) is at the SMA site for the month of June.** Our Lady of the Holy Cross will host the month of July, and St. Augustine will host the month of August.

***For the summer months, Monday morning Mass will be at 10:00 a.m. at Hillside Rehab and Healthcare Center (1265 McLaran Ave, 63147).** When the St. Louis Catholic Academy All-School Mass resumes, the "Hillside Mass" will discontinue and a prayer service will be held instead.

***Look forward to future faith formation opportunities from our new Spiritual Life Committee.** A new faith-sharing event, "This Is My Story... This Is My Song," will premiere on Sunday, 6/30, after the 10:00 a.m. Mass. With this event, parish members will have the chance to offer personal testimonies on a monthly basis. ***The appeal process for SMA is still underway.** Unfortunately, there is not a definite timeline for this process. When the decision regarding the appeal is finalized, our parish will continue with the process of naming the new parish (whether it is three or four parish merger). A primary place of worship for the new merger will then be decided in the subsequent months.

***A common website servicing our four parishes can be accessed at www.3saintsandourlady.com.** This website continues to receive updates and modifications, so please continue to peruse on a regular basis.

***Children's Liturgy of the Word will continue to be offered every week at the 10:00 a.m. Mass except on 4th Sundays when we have our "Youth Sunday."** All children (pre-school age and up) are invited to attend.

***The repairs to the basement of the St. Charles Lwanga Center building on the campus of SEMJB are complete.** The additional plumbing repair (plumbing stack replacement) is also complete.

***St. Louis Catholic Academy is moving its location to the former La Salle Charter School building (1106 N. Jefferson Ave, St. Louis, MO 63106).** As for the soon-to-be vacant school building on the campus of SEMJB, the parish is considering leasing this property to schools seeking new locations. Updates will be provided when available.
