

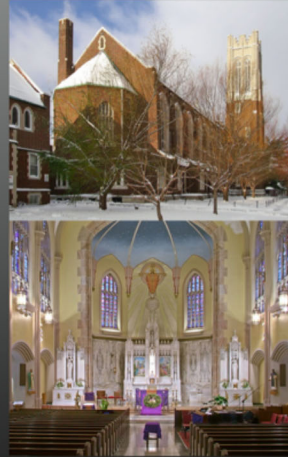

Third Sunday of Advent

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Grace to you and peace! Well, we have arrived at the third Sunday of the Advent season, a Sunday known as “Gaudete Sunday.”

“Gaudete” is the Latin word for “rejoice.” This title is pulled both from today’s entrance antiphon and from today’s Second Reading. In St. Paul’s Letter to the Philippians, he writes, “Rejoice in the Lord always; again I say, rejoice” (4:4). In the Latin we read “Gaudete in Domino semper...” Hence, we refer to it as “Gaudete Sunday.” This is also the Sunday where the priests and deacons wear rose vestments. Rose is symbolic of joy, in particular, the joy of the Holy Spirit.

Now, this appeal of St. Paul is not just a little advice or an encouragement. Surprisingly, it’s a command! And not only is he telling his audience at Philippi to rejoice, he is saying to do it always. The good news here is that whenever the Lord gives a command, he also gives us the power to fulfill it! His words are not empty words meant to place unnecessary burdens on us. No! His words have the power to effect what they signify. God never leaves us without. Whatever the circumstances, God promises us He will always supply sufficient grace. It is for us to trust in His word and step out in faith. So, let us heed this command and rejoice in Him! For, as St. Paul tells us, “...the Lord is near” (Philippians 4:5). He is “Emmanuel,” “God-with-us” always!

This Wednesday, 12/18, to prepare our hearts and minds for the “coming of the Lord,” our parish will be hosting a “Reconciliation Evening” where we will have priests on-hand to hear confessions beginning at 6:00 p.m. I want to encourage you to take advantage of this opportunity. A helpful resource to guide you through “making a confession” is provided in this week’s bulletin (see pg. 7). Check it out!

Well, my prayers remain for you all! May the peace and joy of the Holy Spirit fill you and your loved ones always!

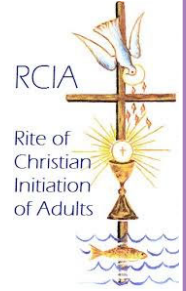
Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA)

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

On May 9, 2024, Pope Francis issued “SPES NON CONFUNDIT” (Hope does not disappoint), Bull of Induction of the Ordinary Jubilee of the Year 2025. The Holy Father invited “everyone to an intense experience of the love of God” and “calls on all Christians to become Pilgrims of Hope.”

The Jubilee 2025 - Pilgrims of Hope will begin on December 24, 2024, with the opening of the Holy Door at the Basilica of St. Peter in Rome and continue until the closing of the Jubilee Year on January 6, 2026.

I invite all the faithful to join Bishop Mark Rivotuso to celebrate the solemn opening of the Jubilee on Sunday, December 29, 2024, at the 10:00 a.m. Mass at the Cathedral Basilica of St. Louis, 4431 Lindell Boulevard. The Jubilee will conclude locally on December 28, 2025.

As part of the Jubilee, the faithful of the Archdiocese of St. Louis will be able to obtain the grace of the Jubilee Indulgence by making a pious pilgrimage to any sacred Jubilee site under the usual conditions. I have designated nine Jubilee pilgrimage sites across the archdiocese:

Basilica of Saint Louis, King of France
Holy Spirit Adoration Sisters at the Mount Grace Covent and Chapel
Carmel of Saint Joseph at the Chapel of the Most Precious Blood
Saint Mary’s of the Barrens National Shrine of Our Lady of the Miraculous Medal
Monastery of Saint Clare of the Immaculate Conception
Passionist Nuns of St. Louis
Immaculate Heart of Mary Catholic Church in New Melle
Immaculate Conception Catholic Church in Union

A Brief Examination of Conscience

Based on the Ten Commandments

I am the LORD your God: you shall not have strange Gods before me.

Have I treated people, events, or things as more important than God?

You shall not take the name of the LORD your God in vain.

Have my words, actively or passively, put down God, the Church, or people?

Remember to keep holy the LORD's Day.

Do I go to Mass every Sunday (or Saturday Vigil) and on Holy Days of Obligation (Jan. 1; the Ascension; Aug. 15; Nov. 1; Dec. 8; Dec. 25)? Do I avoid, when possible, work that impedes worship to God, joy for the Lord's Day, and proper relaxation of mind and body? Do I look for ways to spend time with family or in service on Sunday?

Honor your father and your mother.

Do I show my parents due respect? Do I seek to maintain good communication with my parents where possible? Do I criticize them for lacking skills I think they should have?

You shall not kill.

Have I harmed another through physical, verbal, or emotional means, including gossip or manipulation of any kind?

You shall not commit adultery.

Have I respected the physical and sexual dignity of others and of myself?

You shall not steal.

Have I taken or wasted time or resources that belonged to another?

You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor.

Have I gossiped, told lies, or embellished stories at the expense of another?

You shall not covet your neighbor's spouse.

Have I honored my spouse with my full affection and exclusive love?

You shall not covet your neighbor's goods.

Am I content with my own means and needs, or do I compare myself to others unnecessarily?

Christ's Two Commandments

How well do we love God and others? Do we love as Christ calls us to? In the Gospel of Matthew, Christ gives us Two Commandments: "He said to him, 'You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest and the first commandment. The second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself. The whole law and the prophets depend on these two commandments'" (Mt 22:37-40).

Not sure what love is? St. Paul describes it for us in his Letter to the Corinthians. Is this how you love God and others? "Love is patient, love is kind. It is not jealous, [love] is not pompous, it is not inflated, it is not rude, it does not seek its own interests, it is not quick-tempered, it does not brood over injury, it does not rejoice over wrongdoing but rejoices with the truth. It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love never fails" (1 Cor 13:4-8).
