We are all on different places on our faith journey but we are all called to help each other become closer to Jesus. Generosity means not putting conditions on our love and mercy.

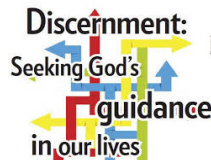

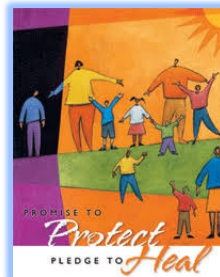

**A BRIEF SUMMARY OF ST. ELIZABETH, MOTHER OF JOHN THE BAPTIST
OUTREACH**

A LITTLE HISTORY OF ST. ELIZABETH, MOTHER OF JOHN THE BAPTIST

In 1891, Most Holy Rosary parish was established on Margareta and Clarence in St. Louis, MO.

Why are we looking at Most Holy Rosary, you ask? Hopefully after reading this, your question will be answered.

Also, in 1891, Archbishop Peter R. Kenrick gave permission to German residents to establish a new parish and school. The plans were developed in the home of Engelbert Schaper, after whom the church was named. With the many changes in leadership over the next 30+ years, it was not until 1927 the church was dedicated. After the dedication of the new church building, the old building was converted into four classrooms to accommodate the growing number of students.

1908 saw the establishment of Most Blessed Sacrament Catholic Church. In 1965, the Sisters of St. Joseph of Carondelet were assigned to run a school at Most Blessed Sacrament. In December, 1975, the Sisters of St. Joseph announced that they would not be returning for the 1976-1977 school year. In September 1976, the closing of the Parish school was approved when no other order of nuns could be found to operate the school.

"By the 1960s, a great change had taken place in the northeastern section of St. Louis. Many of the old families moved to the County, and the community changed from a German to an African-American community, which it remains today. According to available information, the church established by the merger of Most Holy Rosary, St. Adalbert, Visitation, St. Anne's Shrine, St. Engelbert, and St. Philip Neri is 'St. Engelbert'. This merger primarily affected the school associated with these parishes, forming "St. Engelbert Focus School" in 1989.

Most Holy Rosary and St. Engelbert Catholic churches merged in 1994 to form St. Elizabeth, Mother of John the Baptist. The church was located at 4330 Shreve Avenue, the current address.

ST. LOUIS CATHOLIC ACADEMY

"The mission of St. Louis Catholic Academy was to provide a culture of excellence for the students and their families so that each member of our community might grow in learning, by faith and with character."

In summarizing the above history, St. Louis Catholic Academy in 2003 came into existence when St. Engelbert Focus School merged with Bishop Healy to become St. Louis Catholic Academy and moved its location to 4720 Carter Avenue. Earlier this year, 2024, St. Louis Catholic Academy was moved by the Archdiocese of St. Louis to its present location at 1106 North Jefferson.

The 4720 Carter Avenue location is presently vacant but prospects are pending.

ST. CHARLES LWANGA CENTER

"A need was recognized for a house or center of spirituality with the African-American Community. Around 1976-1979 various people along with the staff of the former Most Blessed Sacrament Parish decided to take a walk in faith. They ventured to explore the possibility of using the former convent of Blessed Sacrament and other apostolates in the area as a house of spiritual formation and leadership development for African-Americans. The pastor of the former Most Blessed Sacrament Parish was instrumental in bring priests/religious and laity together to formulate a plan to make it happen."

"The Center was formally established in 1978. It was important that as many parishes as possible were represented in this venture, which led several area parishes to agree to sponsor the efforts of the Center. In April, 2017, recognizing and affirming the expanded scope of the Center, the St. Charles Lwanga Center became known as the Archdiocesan Office of Black Catholic Ministries."

4746 Carter Avenue where the Center was located is presently vacant but prospects are pending.

"The Center practices a spirit of collaborative Christianity dedicated to helping to build up the Body of Christ as we serve God in the St. Louis Archdiocese and by extension, the world."
