**Thirty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time**

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Grace to you and peace! **As mentioned last week, the month of November in the Catholic Church is dedicated, in part, to All Souls.** This is a special time of the year where we make a concerted effort to honor and pray for the faithful departed. As a way of honoring those who have passed in the last year, we will be offering them special tribute at our Masses this weekend. Eternal rest grant unto them, O' Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them! We also pray for the consolation of the families who are mourning their loved ones. May the Holy Spirit, the Divine Comforter, give them solace and peace.

**There is a longstanding tradition of praying for the deceased in the Catholic Church.** The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* teaches us, "From the beginning the Church has honored the memory of the dead and offered prayers in suffrage for them, above all the Eucharistic sacrifice, so that, thus purified, they may attain the beatific vision of God. The Church also commends almsgiving, indulgences, and works of penance undertaken on behalf of the dead" (para. 1032). Even prior to the "birth" of the Church at Pentecost, we hear of the ancient Jews offering intercession for their deceased loved ones: "Thus he [Judas Maccabeus] made atonement for the dead that they might be absolved from their sin" (2 Maccabees 12:46). Praying for the deceased has even been recognized as one the seven spiritual works of mercy (Spiritual Words of Mercy: Counseling the Doubtful; Instructing the Ignorant; Admonishing the Sinner; Comforting the Sorrowful; Forgiving Injuries; Bearing Wrongs Patiently; *Praying for the Living and the Dead* [usccb.org]). Let us, therefore, not waver in this noble responsibility to intercede for our brothers and sisters who have passed on to the next life.

In addition to praying for the deceased this weekend, **we also extend our prayers to our Veterans!** On Monday, November 11<sup>th</sup>, the nation celebrates its annual Veteran's Day. Thank you, Veterans, for your service to our country! And thank you to all who currently serve in the armed forces of our country, especially those from our parish! May God bless and protect you and may His holy angels watch over you!

Well, I hope this week brings you an abundance of blessings from on High. Know that my prayers remain for you and your loved ones and for all your intentions. God bless and keep you always!

**WHAT HAPPENED AT THE PARISH LAST WEEK?**

The week started off with Father Scheiderer and some of our parish family taking a short four day trip to Montgomery, Alabama, where they took in some museums and visited some sites where historical events occurred, such as, the Montgomery Bus Boycott.

Once home to the First White House of the Confederacy, Montgomery grew to become the center of the Civil Rights Movement, notably the Montgomery Bus Boycotts.

Black Alabamans became a driving force of the modern Civil Rights Movement, which arguably began when Rosa Parks refused to give up her seat to a white man on a Montgomery bus. Over the next year, the Reverend Martin Luther King Jr., a 26-year-old local Black pastor, led the Montgomery Bus Boycott.

**ALL SAINTS**

Upon returning from their short vacation, Fr. Scheiderer and parish staff prepared our now Primary Place of Worship, the former site of St. Elizabeth, Mother of John the Baptist located at Shreve and Carter, for its inaugural Mass, which happened to be All Saints Day, a holy day of obligation on November 1.

To show our respect to all the saints who have lived lives of faith in dedication to God, we brought some 80 plus relics from our four combined parishes to show our gratitude to these models of exemplary faith.

Our relics will be on display in the sanctuary on the side altars of Mary and Joseph throughout the month of November.

**ALL SOULS**

The next day, November 2, was another holy day, All Souls.

Because so much focus has recently been on deciding our Primary Place of Worship, it was decided to delay our celebration of All Souls Day, a day of remembrance for the faithful departed, until the weekend of November 9 and 10.

A special tribute will be offered to all the faithful departed who have passed in the last year at our Masses this weekend.

**RETIREMENT FUND FOR RELIGIOUS**

Last weekend, November 2 and 3, we had a special collection to support the Retirement Fund for Religious.
