

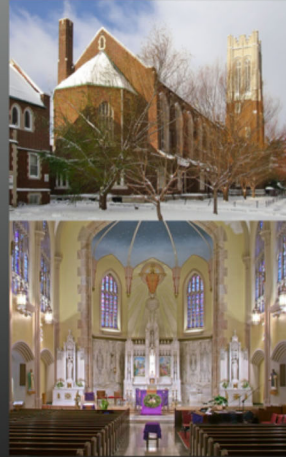

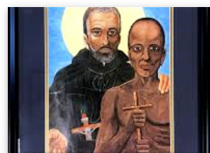
Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,  
Grace to you and peace and happy new “liturgical” year! **The beginning of the Advent season always signals a new “Church calendar” year.** This year we enter into the “C” cycle which highlights the *Gospel of Luke*. I’ve mentioned before, the Church rotates through a three-year cycle for the Saturday Vigil/Sunday Masses: Year A (*Gospel of Matthew*), Year B (*Gospel of Mark*), and Year C (*Gospel of Luke*). So, every year a specific Gospel predominates. The *Gospel of John* is then worked in throughout the holy seasons of Advent/Christmas and Lent/Easter and occasionally in Ordinary Time.

Well, I don’t know about you, but for me, **the beginning of a new year means “resolutions,” specifically, “spiritual resolutions.”** Advent is a great time to start afresh! Perhaps you consider making a spiritual commitment (fasting, prayer, and/or almsgiving) as we prepare our hearts and minds for the coming of Christ. The word “Advent”, you might know, is derived from the original Latin words of “*ad*” (“to”) and “*venire*” (“come”). Thus, the focus of this season is preparation for the coming of Christ, both in His Second Coming and in His coming “anew” at Christmas. As the Church proclaims, “... it is a period of devout and expectant delight.”

**This weekend at our 10:00 a.m. Mass, those serving as Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion will be formally commissioned for service at our parish.** Thank you EMHCs for your willingness to minister in this capacity! EMHCs are a great help both inside and outside of Mass. At Mass, they help distribute Holy Communion to faithful, and outside of Mass, they offer their time and energy to ensure the sick and the homebound receive the Eucharist on a regular basis. If you’re interested in this ministry or any of our other liturgical ministries (choir/musician, lector, server, usher, etc.), please consider contacting me (scottscheiderer@archstl.org) or our parish secretaries and we’ll get you connected. Thank you!

Well, my prayers remain for you all as we begin a new “Church” year! May your Advent season be blessed and filled with renewed hope! God bless you and your loved ones!

The theme of the first week of Advent is **hope**. The first candle is called the Prophets' Candle, symbolizing hope.

We now ask when writing a check to the Parish you enter St. Peter Claver Parish in the "Pay to the Order Of" area of the check.

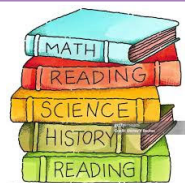
Checks now made out incorrectly will be returned to the originator asking them to issue a new check made out properly to St. Peter Claver Parish.

**SCRIP PROGRAM**

The holidays are quickly approaching. For those of you who are unable to get to the store or prefer to avoid the crowds, we offer you a solution, our **Scrip Program**. In a nutshell, you purchase gift cards from a wide range of vendors with cash or check, we order them and have them for you the next weekend. Our Parish benefits as each vendor has agreed to a percentage discount on each card purchased. So, you pay the full denomination amount of the card, the discounted percentage is applied and the discounted portion stays at the Parish. We do not keep any cards on hand. **FR. CYPRIAN DAVIS, OSB**

Davis was born in Washington, D.C., on September 9, 1930. He converted to Catholicism in his teenage years and became interested in joining the priesthood as well as becoming a monk. Though many monastic communities (and most Catholic religious institutes) did not accept African Americans at the time, after high school Davis joined the seminary of St. Meinrad Archabbey (1949–1956). He became a novice on July 31, 1950, took the monastic name Cyprian on August 1, 1951, and was ordained a priest on May 3, 1956. He was the first African American to join that monastic community.

Davis received a Licentiate of Sacred Theology from the Catholic University of America (1957), before going to the Catholic University of Louvain, Belgium to study Church history, obtaining his *Doctoral en Sciences Historiques* (D.Hist.Sci.) from Louvain, in 1963. While there, Davis focused his work on the Church during the Middle Ages to avoid American Church history and concerns of race and slavery. Upon his first return from Belgium in 1963, he taught church history at Saint Meinrad Seminary, and eventually became the school's first professor emeritus in 2012.

Having returned to the US in the midst of the civil rights movement, Davis attended the August 1963 March on Washington and heard Martin Luther King Jr. deliver his "I Have a Dream" speech. He would later march with Mary Antona Ebo and others in the Selma to Montgomery marches.

As a black Catholic professor, he began to be invited to speak in black parishes and was constantly asked about the place of African Americans in the Catholic church. He was involved in writing two pastoral letters on race, "Brothers and Sisters to Us" (1979) and "What We Have Seen and Heard" (1984), and later received a grant from the Lilly Endowment to study the black Catholic church, resulting in the publication of his award-winning *The History of Black Catholics in the United States* (1990).

Davis died on May 18, 2015, in Memorial Hospital in Jasper, Indiana, at age 84.
