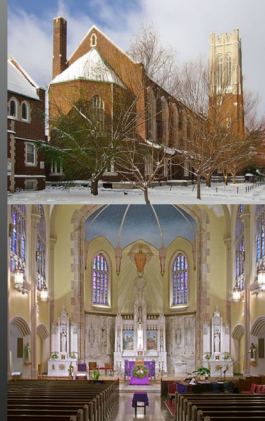

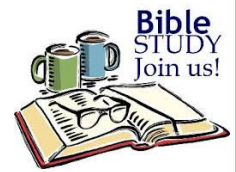

BRIEF SUMMARIES OF ST. AUGUSTINE COMMUNITY ORGANIZATIONS

FR. BOB'S OUTREACH PROGRAMS

Fr. Bob's Outreach located at 1371 Hamilton Avenue pays quarterly rent to the Archdiocese of St. Louis, St. Augustine Catholic Church. Their programs/services are listed below.

Utility Assistance

- ⇒ Our objective is to help low income households, those who are at risk of utility shutoffs, get through difficult times. This program is provided year round.
- ⇒ Community families, facing possible eviction due to overdue rent, are also provided assistance.
- ⇒ Utility and rental assistance is provided every Monday, Wednesday and Friday. Those being blessed with assistance must have their identification, utility bill or rental agreement and \$25 cash or money order. The \$25 will be matched with up to \$125 toward their bill.

Christmas Baskets

- ⇒ As part of our mission to serve others during the Christmas season every year, we give away \$50 Save-A-Lot gift cards and over 900 shoe and clothing certificates.
- ⇒ 97% of the donations go directly to the recipients.
- ⇒ Even though this is a once a year program, we accept donations all year round.

Funeral Assistance

- ⇒ We all know that the passing of a loved one is stressful. Fr. Bob's Outreach tries to lighten the burden and stress by assisting with a monetary stipend of \$100 for funeral assistance.

ST. AUGUSTINE WELLSTON CENTER SERVICES

The Wellston Center is leased to the St. Augustine Wellston Center. It is a 501c3. It is leased for \$1.00 per year. The landlord is responsible for the maintenance of this location.

Food Pantry

- ⇒ The following zip codes are served by the Wellston Center: 63112, 63133, 63121, and 63120.
- ⇒ Guests are allowed to visit once per month and must bring a current piece of mail and ID as proof of residency.
- ⇒ Guests are provided nutritious bags of food that are assembled by volunteers based on the number of people in their household. Personal hygiene items; i.e., shampoo, soap, toothpaste, feminine products, adult and baby diapers and lotion, are also included in their bags.
- ⇒ **Hours of Operation: Tuesday and Wednesday, 7:30 - 10:00 a.m.**

Thrift Store

- ⇒ The Wellston Center features a large variety of pre-owned, high-quality clothes, furniture, shoes, household items, linens, toys and accessories.
- ⇒ The Center has served a dual purpose: to help those in need of donating gently used items, and to provide great finds for those looking to buy at accessible prices. The merchandise we carry offers shoppers opportunities to find tasteful, functional and affordable items.
- ⇒ **Hours of Operation: Friday and Saturday, 9:00 a.m. – 12:00 p.m.**

Social Services

We seek to support, empower and provide high quality resources and services to our community in a safe and secure environment. Our success isn't measured in terms of wealth or profit margin, but by the value we provide to those we serve.

Birthday Baskets – are volunteer-assembled baskets that we gift to clients during their birth month. Each basket has an assortment of food items, toiletries, and age-specific small gift items. Every basket contains a cake mix, icing and cake pan.

Backpacks for Kids – Using donations from volunteers, civic organizations, churches and retail stores, the food pantry offers school book bags filled with the items youth need, from writing utensils, folders, and flash drives to hand sanitizer, tissue boxes and binders.

Health Screenings – Registered nurses provide health screenings to clients during food pantry hours. Blood pressure and blood sugar screening, nutrition, health habit education and medication instruction are available. Assistance locating health providers that are close by is also provided.

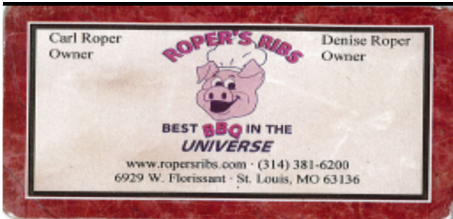
Nutrition Education – Education about shopping, cooking and nutrition helps build the food skills needed to put healthy meals on the table every day.

Senior Support - Through the St. Louis Area Foodbank, we distribute boxes of shelf-stable foods to eligible seniors. This program is intended to help low-income seniors supplement the food they can afford to buy at the store.

Christmas Club – The Christmas Club's clients are offered an opportunity to be able to choose from new products to decide what they truly need to make their holiday season magical.
