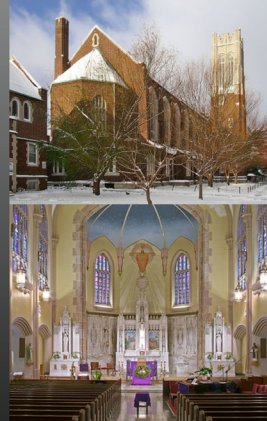

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Grace to you and peace! A huge “thank you” to all who have participated in the parish naming process! We have distilled our “Top 3” names, and they are now ready for submittal to the Archbishop for final approval. After the announcement of our new parish name, the process for determining the primary place of worship will begin. This will be a lengthier process wherein we will visit each parish site and evaluate its strengths and weaknesses based on specific criteria. In the coming weeks, I will share the details of how we will rate each location and its fitness for being our primary place of worship. The hope is to begin this formal evaluation process the weekend following Labor Day (9/7-9/8). All parishioners will be invited to give their input so please consider being a part of this discernment.

In the meantime, after consultation with the Transition Team, I have decided to continue our weekend worship site rotation. For the month of September, the weekend Masses will be at our St. Augustine location, and as the worship site evaluations conclude in October, St. Matthew will host. Tentatively, the primary place of worship will be announced in mid-October. As an additional note, in deciding the primary place of worship, this does not mean the other locations will fall into disuse. How we will utilize our various facilities will be assessed on an ongoing basis. Please continue to pray for our parish family as we come together as one! Many difficult decisions lie ahead, and we want to be sure that we are always following the lead of the Holy Spirit!

In our Gospel this weekend, we continue our journey through the Gospel of John, “Chapter 6.” In this segment of Jesus’ “Bread of Life” discourse, His audience reacts rather strongly to his words. In fact, we hear that “The Jews quarreled (literally, “fought”) among themselves, saying, ‘How can this man give us [his] flesh to eat?’” (John 6:52). These words are shocking to His audience because the Law expressly forbade the eating of blood or of flesh with any blood left in it (let alone eating human flesh!). Surprisingly, Jesus, in light of His audience’s reaction, increases the boldness of His teaching. He, in a sense, “doubles-down” on the truth of His words (John 6:53-58)! These are important words to ponder as we consider our belief in the True Presence of Jesus—Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity—as the Eucharist. Lord, we believe, help our unbelief (Mark 9:24).

Well, my prayers remain for you all... Have a blessed week! God loves you!

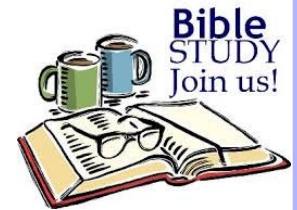

## PROCESS OVERVIEW FOR NAMING A NEW PARISH — ALMOST THERE

- ☉ On the weekend of August 3<sup>rd</sup>/4<sup>th</sup>, there was a list of proposed parish names inserted in the bulletin. Parishioners placed an asterisk (\*) next to the name they preferred and returned their sheets to the collection basket. They also submitted votes in-person at the parish office, through the phone, and through email. The deadline for submittals was the end of business, Thursday, August 8<sup>th</sup> (5:00 p.m.). On Friday, August 9<sup>th</sup>, a team of parish staff members tabulated the results.
- ☉ Last week, August 10<sup>th</sup>/11<sup>th</sup>, a list of the “Top 7” vote-getters was inserted in the bulletin. Parishioners had the opportunity to rank their three most preferred names placing a “1” next to their 1<sup>st</sup> choice, a “2” next to their 2<sup>nd</sup> choice, and a “3” next to their 3<sup>rd</sup> choice. The ranking results were calculated according to a point value system (1<sup>st</sup> place votes received “3 points,” 2<sup>nd</sup> place votes received “2 points,” and 3<sup>rd</sup> place votes received “1 point”). The deadline for ranking their preferred names was the end of business, Thursday, August 15<sup>th</sup> (5:00 p.m.). On Friday, August 16<sup>th</sup>, parish staff members calculated the point totals for all the rankings.
- ☉ Lastly, this weekend, August 17<sup>th</sup>/18<sup>th</sup>, the point value for each parish name is available as an insert in the bulletin. The “Top 3” names will be presented to Archbishop Mitchell T. Rozanski, and he will confirm our parish name.

### MASS OFFERING/MASS INTENTION

**A Mass Offering is an offering attached to celebrating a Mass for a particular intention;** i.e., healing, death, special anniversary, special birthday or special intention. Mass offerings may be requested for a special date; i.e., anniversary of death, wedding anniversary, etc., but must be verified the date is available and has not already been requested by another individual. Only one offering a day is permitted. This verification is done by Fr. Scheiderer. The offering to be given for the celebration of the Mass for a particular intention is ten dollars for the Province of St. Louis. “If a member of the faithful spontaneously gives a larger or smaller offering, however, it may be accepted.” The Mass Offering will be recorded in the Parish bulletin. Envelopes are available at the entrances to church for your convenience.

### SAFE ENVIRONMENT PROGRAM

**All volunteers and employees who work with children must be in full compliance with the Safe Environment Program.** This includes attending Protecting God’s Children workshop, undergoing a background check, and signing the Code of Ethical Conduct. These requirements are mandated by the United States Council of Catholic Bishops and are followed by every diocese in the country. The policies are the Church’s attempt to ensure the suitability of all adults who work or volunteer around your children. If you have any questions about your compliance, please contact any of our parish child safety coordinators.
