Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Grace to you and peace! Thank you to all who participated in the day of service at our St. Augustine location! This was a combined effort of both Our Lady of Lourdes Catholic Church in University City and our own parish. The crews worked diligently to clean-up both the Parish Hall and the Gym. Also, work was done around the campus to help beautify the property. More campus clean-ups are anticipated in the future so stay tuned for those. Our youth, young adult, and adult volunteers have helped out now at both the St. Elizabeth, Mother of John the Baptist and St. Augustine properties. The hope is to plan campus clean-ups at the Our Lady of the Holy Cross and St. Matthew, the Apostle sites in the near future. Thank you, again, to all our volunteers!

In today’s Gospel, we witness a poignant scene between Jesus and the man with many possessions. Though this particular interaction is recounted both in the Gospel of Matthew (19:16-22) and in the Gospel of Luke (Luke 18:18-23), it is only in the Gospel of Mark (10:17-22) that we hear a special detail. Before inviting the man to “Go, sell what you have, and give to the poor,” we hear, “Jesus, looking at him, loved him” (Mark 10:21). It is the “gaze of divine love” that sets apart Mark’s version! Sadly, in response, the man with many possessions does not capture this look, “At that statement, his face fell,” and from there, “he went away sad” (Mark 10:22). Had this man caught the “loving gaze” of our Lord, would he have abandoned everything and followed Him? That’s an important question to consider! Also, you might consider how His loving gaze is trying to penetrate your heart. No matter where we are in our relationship with the Lord, whether we are in the beginning stages or far along, His call is always to greater union with Himself. Let us pray we have the courage to heed His summons and “Put out into the deep” (Luke 5:4). God bless and keep you always! My prayers remain for you and your loved ones!

### **STEWARDSHIP ALIVE**

Consider some of these thoughts on Stewardship and becoming a disciple-maker.

- ⇒ Before you can help others, you have to be a disciple in more than word only.
- ⇒ People believe people who “walk the talk”.
- ⇒ Ask the Holy Spirit for guidance. He will show up.
- ⇒ Do it for the glory of God, not the glory of me.
- ⇒ We plant the seeds of faith; the Holy Spirit does the actual conversion.
- ⇒ Active listening - listen to understand, not to build your response or explain why they are wrong.
- ⇒ The core of friendship is trust and the seed of trust is humility.
- ⇒ Walking with someone on their faith journey means that I am available to them on their schedule, not mine.
- ⇒ Share your faith story with others; share the highs and lows of your faith journey.
- ⇒ Personal invitations work the best.
- ⇒ Inviting someone to Mass may not be the first step, may need to build up to that; invite them to events that they may have interest in first.

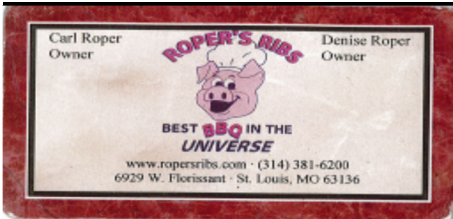
