Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Grace to you and peace! I extend a huge “thank you” to all who participated in our first site visit and evaluation last weekend at the St. Augustine location. Also, thank you to our Transition Team for all your input in helping formulate the parish information sheets and evaluation packets. Your help in this process has been invaluable! For all those who were hoping to be at the site visit but couldn’t attend, please contact me via email (scottscheiderer@archstl.org), and I will get you the necessary information and evaluation handouts so you can participate. Our next site visit will be Saturday, September 21st, at 11:00 a.m. at the St. Matthew, the Apostle (SMA), location. I hope to see you there!

This weekend marks a special celebration, the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross! This feast is especially dear to our parishioners who hail from the Our Lady of the Holy Cross (OLHC) site as this was their former patronal feast. To honor this holy day, there will be an extra Sunday Mass at the OLHC site at 12:00 p.m. and following this celebration, there will be a chicken dinner from 1:00 to 4:00 p.m. Please consider attending this wonderful event!

Another glorious feast day dear to many of our parishioners is on the horizon. Next Saturday, September 21st, marks the Feast of St. Matthew, Apostle and Evangelist! To pay tribute to this great patron, SMA will host a special noon Mass on Friday, 9/20, in anticipation of Saturday’s feast. Again, consider joining in this exalted celebration!

In our Gospel this weekend, we hear Peter’s great confession of faith, “You are the Messiah” (Mark 8:29). Surprisingly, this act of faith is immediately followed by a sharp rebuke when Peter refuses to accept Jesus’ prediction that the “Son of Man must suffer greatly and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests, and the scribes, and be killed, and rise after three days” (Mark 8:31). This serves as an important reminder that we can quickly descend from godly thinking to thinking “as human beings do” (Mark 8:33) in a matter of seconds. Thus, we must be diligent in seeking a faith-informed worldview at every moment of our lives. A short but powerful prayer in this regard is the prayer of the apostles in the Gospel of Luke: “Increase our faith” (17:5). I love using this simple yet profound petition in moments when my thinking is taking a downward turn. Without fail, it always seems to help me “think of what is above, not of what is on earth” (Colossians 3:2). Thank you, Lord!

Well, may God fill you with His holy light this week and always... My prayers remain for you all!

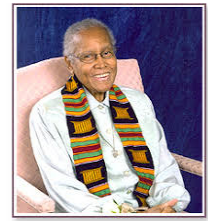

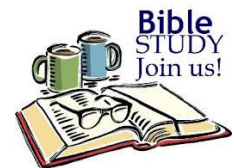

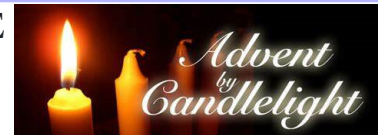

BRIEF SUMMARIES OF ST. MATTHEW'S COMMUNITY ORGANIZATIONS

ST. MATTHEW, THE APOSTLE'S OUTREACH PROGRAMS

Founded in 1893, St. Matthew the Apostle (SMA) is in the historic "Ville" neighborhood in north St. Louis City.

A Mass dedicating the new Shrine of St. Peter Claver was celebrated by the Most Rev. Edward M. Rice, Auxiliary Bishop of St. Louis at St. Matthew, the Apostle Church on Sunday, June 23, 2013.

St. Matthew Parish also had a first-class relic of St. Peter Claver on display. The relic, a bone fragment, is believed to have been validated in 1934. The relic was likely brought with the Jesuits when they moved from the former St. Malachy Parish to St. Matthew.

Final note, St. Matthew tithes with various charitable organizations at the end of every month.

THE RICE CENTER

The Rice Center located at 4145 Kennerly Avenue is owned by and is a property on the St. Matthew, the Apostle parish. SMA leases the property to The Child and Family Empowerment Center. The Child and Family Empowerment Center (CAFE) provides a menu of goods and services to empower children and their families "to overcome challenges and build a stronger, more resilient community". The Child and Family Empowerment Center under the leadership of Pastor Marsha Hawkins-Hourd pays rent to SMA to the tune of \$3,528 a month.

COMMUNITY ORGANIZATIONS

NORTHSIDE YOUTH AND SENIOR SERVICE CENTER

North Side Youth and Senior Service Center (Northside) sits on the property where the SMA's convent once resided. SMA Parish sold the property located at 4120 Maffitt Ave. to Northside.

Today Northside has three programs for the youth (Youth Services) serving the surrounding community:

- ⇒ Summer Camp for ages 5-17
- ⇒ Peabody After School Program (this program serves the students of the elementary school and is available from 3:00-6:00 p.m. at the school)
- ⇒ Computer Club (students between the ages of 5-17) at the computer lab at the Center.

The Seniors are also provided for through three programs:

- ⇒ Food and Nutrition (Meals on Wheels and Congregate Meals program) provides healthy, nutritious meals every weekday
- ⇒ Transportation Program (provides rides to seniors and disabled within the city limits; i.e., doctor appointments, shopping trips, etc.)
- ⇒ Health and Safety (a senior fitness program and senior screenings).

Both, Youth and Senior programs, work to "connect children, teens, families and seniors with other resources in the community.

NORTHSIDE COMMUNITY HOUSING

The Northside Community Housing, Inc. (NCHI) is a non-profit, community development corporation serving St. Louis City and has been a part of Northside since 1977 and in 2003 became an independent housing organization.

In addition to owning and developing affordable housing, NCHI has been a key organization in providing support to youth programs, community gardens, and other community initiatives in north St. Louis City. Some accomplishments include:

- ◆ development of 301 new and rehab homes for community members and their families
- ◆ completed home repairs (minor) for 40 homeowners
- ◆ recreated 11 vacant lots into community gardens.

MASS OFFERING/MASS INTENTION

A Mass Offering is an offering attached to celebrating a Mass for a particular intention; i.e., healing, death, special anniversary, special birthday or special intention. Mass offerings may be requested for a special date; i.e., anniversary of death, wedding anniversary, etc., but must be verified the date is available and has not already been requested by another individual. Only one offering a day is permitted. This verification is done by Fr. Scheiderer. The offering to be given for the celebration of the Mass for a particular intention is ten dollars for the Province of St. Louis. "If a member of the faithful spontaneously gives a larger or smaller offering, however, it may be accepted." The Mass Offering will be recorded in the Parish bulletin. Envelopes are available at the entrances to church for your convenience.
