

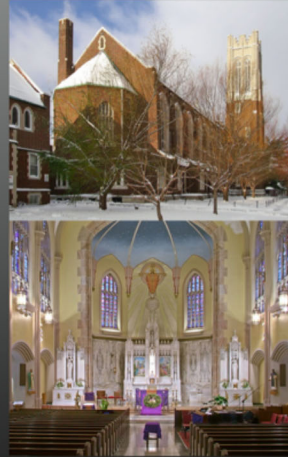

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Grace to you and peace! Well, it's hard to believe but Thanksgiving is right around the corner. I hope you are able to join the parish family as we celebrate **our annual Thanksgiving Day Mass, November 28th, at 9:00 a.m. (4330 Shreve Ave.)**. Following Mass, **consider stopping by the former Our Lady of the Holy Cross site for our annual Thanksgiving Day Community Dinner from 10:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. located in the Parish Center cafeteria**. Thank you to all who have contributed to this meal by donating food items and volunteering your time! It is greatly appreciated! If you're interested in helping with this effort or plan on stopping by, please contact the parish office. Also, the **Knights and Ladies of St. Peter Claver** are hosting their annual "Feast of Thanksgiving" on **Saturday, November 30th, from 12:00 p.m. to 3:00 p.m. at the St. Alphonsus "Rock" Church gym**. Lots of opportunities to feast and fellowship this Thanksgiving! Thank you, Lord!

This week we celebrate the **33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time**. That means we are close to the end of the liturgical year. There are 34-weeks in the Ordinary Time calendar, and the final week is "set-apart" and reserved for the special Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe (or simply, "Christ the King"). In fact, since next week is "set-apart," this will actually be **the final week in our journey through the Gospel of Mark**. I've mentioned before that, in the Church, we are on a 3-year liturgical cycle (Year A, B, and C), and each year highlights a specific Gospel. "Year A" is dedicated to St. Matthew, "Year B" to St. Mark, and finally, "Year C" to St. Luke (St. John's Gospel is integrated throughout). So, we've come to the end of our trek through the *Gospel of Mark*, and fittingly, we close with a talk about "The End," Jesus' famous "Olivet" discourse (His "End Times" talk given from the Mount of Olives). This particular chapter of Mark's Gospel has been regarded as one of the most difficult to interpret, but nonetheless, the central theme is clear: "Be prepared!" We hear the memorable line: "But of the day or hour, no one knows, neither the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father" (Mark 13:32). It's a humbling lesson to know that in an instant our lives can take a dramatic turn. Let us, therefore, never take this life for granted, especially, the life we share in Christ!

Lord, we ask You, help us to be always vigilant and present to You, waiting with that expectant hope for Your Coming. My prayers remain for you and your loved ones! God bless!

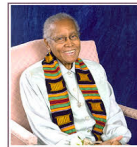

WHAT HAPPENED AT THE PARISH LAST WEEK?

SOLEMNITY OF ST. ENGELBERT

On Thursday, November 7, we celebrated the Solemnity of St. Engelbert. St. Engelbert is the patron saint of the original church building of St. Elizabeth, Mother of John the Baptist. As we celebrated many of the patronal saints of the former churches in the past few months, we now honor this martyr bishop of the 13th century with a special 12:00 p.m. Mass and adoration. A time of fellowship and refreshments followed in the rectory. St. Engelbert, pray for us!



THE COMMEMORATION OF ALL THE FAITHFUL DEPARTED

To honor the faithful departed, we have placed a "Book of the Deceased" near the sanctuary where parishioners can inscribe the names of their loved ones who have passed on to the next life. All throughout the month of November, we will call them to mind and pray for them at our Masses.

Additionally, there is the "Book of the Deceased" that will specifically honor the deceased parishioners of the past year. This book has been artistically inscribed by the Holy Spirit Adoration Sisters (The "Pink Sisters"), and is also displayed in the sanctuary. Eternal rest grant unto them, O' Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them!

COLLECTION OF RELICS

We invite you to come forward following Mass to view the many relics of saints we have on display in the sanctuary throughout the month of November. We as a combined church family have an extensive collection of relics, and we want you to have an opportunity to share in this great treasure. You will find them located on the side altars of Mary and Joseph.

DANIEL ARTHUR RUDD

August 7, 1854 to December 3, 1933

"Daniel Rudd was born on August 7, 1854, on Anatok Plantation in Bardstown, Kentucky to enslaved parents Robert and Elizabeth Rudd. Daniel and all 11 of his siblings were baptized in the Catholic Church.

Rudd was very religious, but it is unknown at what point in his life he decided to make the promotion of Catholicism his life's work. He was eventually emancipated from slavery and moved to Springfield, Ohio while still a young adult, sometime before 1876.

He was a Black Catholic journalist and early Civil Rights leader.

He is known for starting in 1885 what has been called "the first newspaper printed by and for Black Americans", the *Ohio Tribune*—which he later expanded into the *American Catholic Tribune*, purported to be the first Black-owned national newspaper. The paper folded in 1897.

He also founded the Colored Catholic Congress in 1889, which held five meetings total and lasted until 1894."

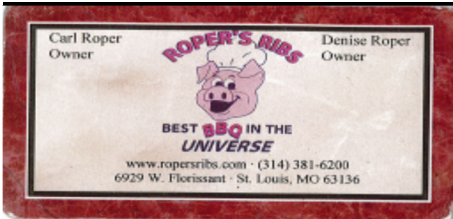
