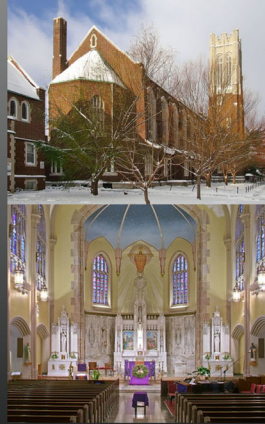

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Grace to you and peace! I hope these words find you well in the Lord as we begin the month of February, the month devoted to African American history. **The 2024 theme for Black History Month is “African Americans and the Arts.”** I am especially thankful for the countless contributions of African Americans in the realm of worship of which we are the beneficiaries week-in and week-out at our liturgies. As I write this “Pastor’s Pen,” I look forward to attending the annual North City Deanery Choir Concert at the Cathedral Basilica of St. Louis on Friday, February 2nd.

This month will also witness to the beginning of the holy season of Lent. **As many of you know, Lent begins early this year on Wednesday, February 14th.** I always find it helpful to begin prepping for the liturgical season in advance. That way, when it starts, I’m ready to go with the spiritual disciplines I’ve committed to for the coming season. I sure hope you are able to participate in our pre-Lenten celebration of Fasching Sonntag/Mardi Gras (February 11th, after the 10 a.m. Mass). It’ll be a great time for our parish family to come together and socialize before the fasting begins.

In our Gospel this weekend, we hear of Jesus taking the time (albeit “time cut short”) to retreat and pray: “Rising very early before dawn, he left and went off to a deserted place, where he prayed” (Mark 1:35). There’s no doubt, Jesus is teaching us in this moment. **We need our time alone with the Lord to pray and be spiritually rejuvenated!** As a priest, I am required by church law to take a mandatory retreat every year. While the Church, of course, can’t require the lay faithful to take an annual retreat, I can’t encourage this practice enough. Just recently, I had the privilege to be on retreat from 1/22-1/26, and it was tremendously fruitful both physically and spiritually. Hopefully, many of you will be able to participate in our upcoming Day of Recollection: Saturday, February 24th!

My prayers remain for you, your loved ones, and for all your intentions. God bless and keep you always!

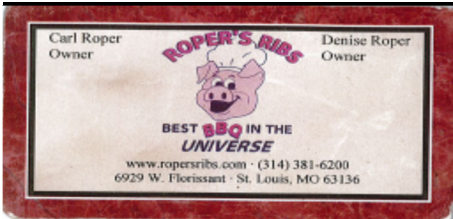
EUCCHARISTIC CONGRESS 2024
