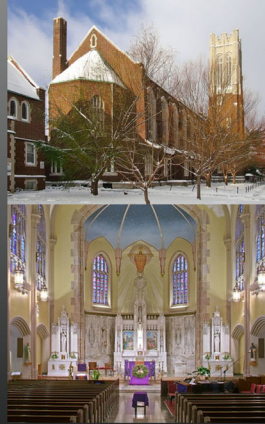

**Pastor’s Pen**

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Grace to you and peace! I hope these words find you well in the Lord!

This weekend, we celebrate the 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time. **In the fall of 2019, Pope Francis declared that “the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time is to be devoted to the celebration, study, and dissemination of the word of God”** (*Motu proprio* declaration, *Aperuit illis* [trans. “He opened it...”]). Officially, this Sunday is known as the “Sunday of the Word of God.” As the document accompanying this solemn pronouncement indicates, though, “...a day devoted to the Bible should not be seen as a yearly event but rather a year-long event.” This special Sunday simply serves as a reminder of our desperate need to be nourished by the word of God on a daily basis and how urgently we need to grow in our knowledge and love of the Scriptures.

**When we actively engage the word of God, it not only effects change in our life but change in the life of the Church.** This has been proven time and again in the 2,000-year history of our Church. Countless saints, on hearing a word and responding in faith, have radically altered the course of Church history (St. Anthony of the Desert, St. Augustine, St. Francis of Assisi, St. Therese of Lisieux ... to name a few). Thus, we need to ask ourselves, “How well are we engaging the Scriptures week-to-week?” What I try to do on a regular basis (some days/weeks are better than others!) is to simply “focus-in” on a word or phrase that was meaningful to me and consider how the Lord, through His word, is inviting me to change. Then, I try to make a resolution in that regard and implement the resolution that day, if possible. Doing this on a regular basis is sure to ignite your prayer life in a significant way.

**Also, last Thursday, 1/18, marked the beginning of the annual Week of Prayer for Christian Unity, which continues through the “Feast of the Conversion of St. Paul” celebrated on January 25<sup>th</sup>.** We all, in some manner, are affected by divisions in the Body of Christ, and it is so necessary that we pray for unity. One of my favorite prayers in the Communion Rite of the Liturgy of the Eucharist is the petition for peace and unity in the Church: “...look not on our sins, but on the faith of your Church, and grant her peace and unity in accordance with your will.” Let us wholeheartedly devote ourselves to this hope! God bless you all and be assured of my prayers!

### Transition Team Update

On Wednesday, January 3<sup>rd</sup>, the Transition Team met online via Google Meet. First on the agenda was to establish **where the weekend and weekday liturgies will be celebrated post-January**. In October of last year, I decided, with the help of the Transition Team, that our weekend liturgies would be celebrated at one location (St. Matthew, the Apostle) for the months of November-January. This was done not only to promote stability with our weekend worship but also to accommodate the Advent/Christmas seasons. Now, with February on the horizon, there was a need to finalize our plans for the upcoming months. After some deliberation, **the Transition Team and I agreed to move back to the “parish rotation” schedule for the next three months**. There will be some modifications to our previous “rotation schedule,” though. All the weekend Masses will be at one location. That is, we will not change locations in between the Saturday Vigil Mass and the Sunday morning Masses. Also, all weekday Masses (Tuesday-Thursday) will be at one location and this location too will rotate from month-to-month. Here’s the proposed schedule for the months of February-April:

#### **Month of February**

Weekend Masses (4:00 pm [Sat.]; 8:00 am/10:00 am [Sun.]) – *Our Lady of the Holy Cross* site

Weekday Masses (12:00 pm [Tues.-Thurs.]) – *St. Augustine* site

#### **Month of March**

Weekend Masses (4:00 pm [Sat.]; 8:00 am/10:00 am [Sun.]) – *St. Augustine* site

Weekday Masses (12:00 pm [Tues.-Thurs.]) – *St. Matthew, the Apostle* site

#### **Month of April**

Weekend Masses (4:00 pm [Sat.]; 8:00 am/10:00 am [Sun.]) – *St. Matthew, the Apostle* site

Weekday Masses (12:00 pm [Tues.-Thurs.]) – *Our Lady of the Holy Cross* site

As we get near the end of this rotation schedule, the Transition Team and I will decide where we go from there. Hopefully, by that time, we will have greater clarity regarding the appeal process and where we stand in regards to the church repairs at our St. Elizabeth, Mother of John the Baptist location.

After solidifying the Mass schedule, **the Transition Team and I reviewed the various celebrations/events of the Advent and Christmas seasons** in order to prepare for the future. We discussed both what worked well and what needed improvement. If you have comments/suggestions/ideas in this regard, please reach out to me or a Transition Team member and share your thoughts. We want your feedback!

Next, **we began to look ahead to the Lent and Easter seasons and the preparations that need to be made for those liturgical seasons**. In previous years, many of our parishes had **pre-Lenten celebrations**, so we decided to meld the various traditions and have **one combined event on the Sunday (2/11) before Ash Wednesday**. Last weekend (1/14) in the parish bulletin, we added an insert promoting this event (*Fasching Sonntag* [German for “Festival Sunday”]/*Mardi Gras* [French for “Fat Tuesday”]). We hope you can attend! Also, if you’re willing to help, please contact our parish offices. Further, discussions were made in regards to planning a **Lenten “Day of Recollection”** for the parish family—adults, young adults, and youth alike. This “Day of Recollection” is still in the planning stages. There will be more details to come.

As we have come together as a parish family in the past 5 months, you have probably noticed that **various committees and organizations are being formed**. Some of these committees/organizations were formed at my initiative and others have been formed at the initiative of your fellow parishioners with my permission. There has been a request for more information regarding what committees/organizations are currently active in our parish. **In the coming weeks, I plan to publish in the bulletin a list of the committees/organizations related to our parish**. Hopefully, this will help parishioners to be aware of what committees/organizations exist, who heads them, and how they can participate. **I certainly desire that all parishioners are involved in some way in the “community life” of the parish**. We all have gifts, and we need to use them at the service of God’s Kingdom!

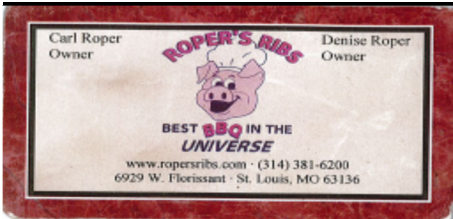
