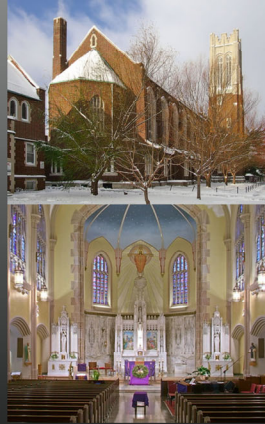

RECONCILIATION

One (1) hour before Mass and by Appointment

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Grace to you and peace! **In this Fourth Week of Lent, we are called to rejoice!** Traditionally, this Sunday is referred to as “*Laetare*” Sunday (“*Laetare*,” from the original Latin word meaning “rejoice”). This title is pulled from our entrance antiphon from Isaiah 66:10-11: “Rejoice, Jerusalem, and all who love her. Be joyful, all who were in mourning; exult and be satisfied at her consoling breast.” We are getting closer to the Easter mystery, so the Church calls on the faithful to be of good cheer. As a sign of this “summons,” the clergy don rose vestments, rose being symbolic of joy, specifically, the joy of the Holy Spirit.

Last week at the 10:00 a.m. Mass, we made a concerted effort to pray for our candidates to be received into the Church with the celebration of the “First Scrutiny.” As mentioned last week, the “Scrutinies” are specific rites designed to encourage and strengthen the candidates in their resolve to come into full communion with Christ and His Church.

Each week, as we progress through the “Scrutinies,” (Three-weeks of prayer for the candidates) a different aspect of the initiation process is highlighted. Last week, emphasis was placed on receiving the purifying waters of the Holy Spirit which flow from Christ, the Redeemer. For those present, you might recall we read the Gospel of the “Samaritan Woman at the Well” (John 4) to draw out this theme. **This week, as we celebrate the “Second Scrutiny,” the focus will shift to receiving Christ, the Light of the World.** The Gospel of the “Man Born Blind” (John 9) is proclaimed, and we are reminded of our need to have our “spiritual” sight restored through the gift of faith. For, it is only through Christ that we are able to come to the fullness of grace and truth (John 1:14).

Please join me in continuing to pray for our candidates as we joyfully anticipate Easter glory, which is now, just on the horizon. God bless and keep you all! May His peace and love infill your hearts and minds always!

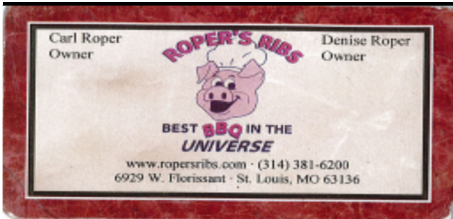
