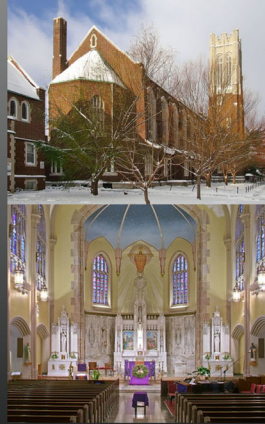

RECONCILIATION

One (1) hour before Mass and by Appointment

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Grace to you and peace! I hope these words find you strong in the Lord. Well, the holy season of Lent is upon us! The Lenten season began on Ash Wednesday, and the Gospel proclaimed that day was pulled from the heart of Jesus' Sermon on the Mount (Matthew 6:1-6, 16-18). In this passage, **Jesus encourages us to take up the practices of fasting, almsgiving, and prayer** to combat the unruly tendencies of our fallen human nature. St. John in his First Letter describes these tendencies as threefold: "...the lust of the flesh and the lust of the eyes and the pride of life" (1 John 2:17, *Revised Standard Version*). An attentive reading of "the Fall" in *Genesis* reveals that these "tendencies" correspond to the lure of the forbidden fruit in the Garden of Eden. The first woman saw that it was "...good for food... a delight to the eyes," and that it could "...make one wise" (Genesis 3:6, *RSV*).

As a result of the transgression of our first parents, humanity now experiences this "threefold" tendency toward sin. **We are inclined to take things, good in themselves, to inordinate extremes:** sensible pleasure, material possessions, a desire to "be like God" (Genesis 3:5). **Fear not, though, Jesus has the remedy! We just need to cooperate with what He prescribes.** Thus, we take up the practices of fasting (tempers our desire for sensible pleasure), almsgiving (tempers our desire to possess), and prayer (rightly orders our participation in the divine nature). Perhaps you consider tailoring your Lenten commitments around these three pillars.

Last week in our bulletin, we included **a list of our parish committees and organizations** so you can be aware of the many ways you can be involved in our parish family. This is a "working document," **so if an organization you're involved in was not listed, please contact our parish offices so we can make that information available.** An updated list will be included in this week's bulletin. (See insert.)

Well, my prayers are with you all as we begin this Lenten journey! May it be a blessed season of spiritual renewal!

Any youth who has been baptized and must be in grades 7th-12th and at least 12 years of age at the time of the administration of the Sacrament. All candidates and their families must attend an information session prior to enrollment.

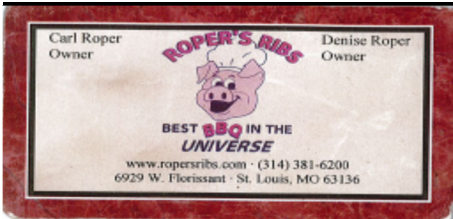
