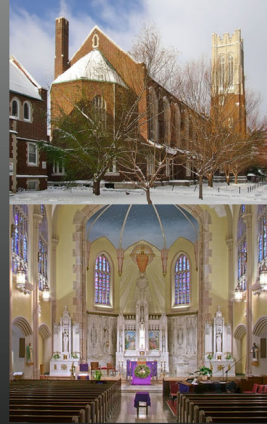

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Grace to you and peace! **And happy “Fasching Sonntag” (German, “Festival Sunday”) and “Mardi Gras” (French, “Fat Tuesday”)! I hope you are able to attend our celebration after the 10:00 a.m. Sunday Mass in the parish cafeteria. It is sure to be a great time to socialize and to build fellowship with each other and the surrounding community.**

Well, the celebration of “Fasching Sonntag” and “Mardi Gras” reminds us that the holy season of Lent is upon us. **Ash Wednesday**, as you know, marks the beginning of this new liturgical season.

We will offer three Masses on this day:

9:00 a.m. at St. Louis Catholic Academy (on the campus of St. Elizabeth, Mother of John the Baptist) and 12:00 p.m. and 6:00 p.m. at the St. Augustine site. Also, **on Fridays during Lent**, we will offer **Stations of the Cross both at 12:00 p.m. and at 6:00 p.m.** An **additional weekday Mass on Friday will follow the Stations at 12:00 p.m.** Remember, in the month of February, our Tuesday-Friday weekday Masses and our Friday devotions will be **at our St. Augustine location.**

In addition to our weekly devotions and our extra Friday Mass, **I’d like to encourage you to take advantage of our Lenten Day of Recollection!**

As you might know, this will be an all-day event for men, women, young adults, youth, and children on Saturday, February 24th. **Also, consider taking part in the North City Interracial Relations Committee’s Lenten Revival!** This will be a three-night event from 2/19 to 2/21 at St. Alphonsus “Rock” Church. Praise and worship begins at 6:15 p.m. and a service follows at 6:30 p.m. Fr. Royce Thomas, CSsR, a revivalist, will host this event.

There are lots of opportunities to “draw near” to our Lord in this holy time! As St. James writes, “Draw near to God and he will draw near to you” (James 4:8). I’m praying this Lent is especially blessed for you all! May God flood you with His abundant grace!

EUCCHARISTIC CONGRESS 2024

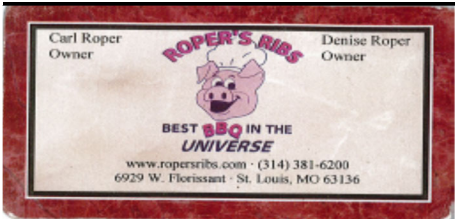
